Always | If You Ask Them

Loving people is hard – especially with difficult people. We just don't feel loving all the time. But if we're going to be like Jesus, we have to figure out a way to love everyone always, not sometimes. And that's the key: we can't do what comes naturally... we're gonna need something supernatural.

1. Who is the most unlovable character from a movie or TV show that you've seen? What makes them so hard to like?
2. Why is loving people so difficult sometimes? Is it more them or us?
3. What is the difference between being able versus being capable? When it comes to loving people, why might that distinction be important?
4. Read **1 Corinthians 13:4-7** out loud. What sticks out to you from the last sentence (verse 7)? What do you think Paul is communicating by wrapping up this paragraph with these words?
5. Jesus loved people despite their past and present circumstances and would often point people toward a better version of themselves in the future. What things do you imagine people said about Jesus and the way he engaged with them?
6. Think about what people might say about you and what you've given them – is there room for improvement? Can you think of one thing in particular?
