



Now John wore clothing of camel's hair with a leather belt around his waist, and his food was locusts and wild honey. To receive a blessing rather than the sacrament, please indicate this to the priest by crossing your arms over your chest.

## A Special Note from Jenny Callison on "The Dual Focus of Advent"

As you sang "Lo! he comes, with clouds descending" last Sunday, you may have asked yourself, "Wait a minute! This is Advent, when we're supposed to be preparing for the birth of Jesus. Why does this hymn talk about the crucified Jesus? Why are we rapturously gazing at glorious scars?"

Yes, this is Advent, and during this season we exist simultaneously in two places in time. We await the birth of the Christ child, but we await his coming again in glory—a second Advent.

One of our hymns this Sunday refers to both. The first three verses of "Hark! A thrilling voice is sounding" (Hymn 59) refer more strongly to Christ's first coming as child who will free us from sin and wake us to the light. But verse 4 looks forward to the second coming, when His love and mercy will save us for all time.

Many Advent hymns in our hymnal focus on this second Advent, drawing imagery from Jesus' parables. The lesson is that we must always be prepared for his return, for "we know not the day nor the hour." There's the story of the wise and foolish virgins: the former stocking up on oil enough to last through a long wait for the bridegroom; the latter having no extra supplies and therefore missing out on the wedding feast (Hymn 62). There's also the parable of the homeowner and the thief: If the owner knew when the thief would break into his home, Jesus points out, he would stay awake and be ready to defend it.

So, while we commemorate the birth of Jesus and the signs that signaled his special nature and his mission on earth, we also prepare for a time in the future when he will return, "Crowned with glory like the sun that lights the morning sky." (Hymn 73)
