II. Course Description

This course provides a theological and historical overview of Reformed Baptist distinctives with an emphasis on confessional identity, covenant theology, ecclesiology, and soteriology. Students will examine how Reformed Baptists differ from other traditions (e.g., Presbyterian, Dispensational, Catholics, and General Baptist) while affirming their place within historic Reformed orthodoxy. Special attention will be given to the 1689 Second London Baptist Confession, as well as key biblical and theological texts that shape the Reformed Baptist tradition.

III. Course Objectives

Students who complete this course will be able to:

- 1. Clearly articulate the distinctives of Reformed Baptist theology.
- 2. Understand the historical development of 1689 Federalism.
- 3. Distinguish between Baptist and non-Baptist covenantal frameworks.
- 4. Articulate a biblical doctrine of the church, ordinances, and confessionalism.

5. Apply Reformed Baptist theology to contemporary church life and ministry.

3. Theological Paper: 100% – Due May 5th

Write a 6–10 page paper addressing one major Reformed Baptist distinctive. Topics may include:

- o The covenantal framework of 1689 Federalism
- o Regenerate church membership
- Confessionalism and church authority
- o The ordinance of believer's baptism
- o Local church autonomy and eldership

4. 10–15 Minute Teaching Presentation: 100% – Due May 19th
