Making Guests Feel Welcome

As we gather each week to worship, learn, and fellowship, let's not forget a crucial part of our calling: to welcome others into our community with open arms. The Bible places great importance on the act of hospitality. Hebrews 13:2 reminds us, "Do not forget to show hospitality to strangers, for by so doing some people have shown hospitality to angels without knowing it." Clearly, how we welcome newcomers can have lasting impact.

A Warm Smile

Nothing says "you're welcome here" like a genuine smile. The power of a warm, friendly smile can't be overestimated, it instantly lifts spirits and sets a positive atmosphere. When you see new faces, greet them with a smile that says, "We're glad you're here!"

Eye Contact

Making eye contact with newcomers not only shows attentiveness but also sincerity. This simple yet meaningful gesture says, "I see you, and I'm glad you've joined us." By giving people your full attention, even briefly, you're conveying the message that they matter to you and to our community.

Handshake or Fist Bump

Whether it's a handshake, fist bump, or a friendly wave, physical gestures contribute to making people feel welcome. Don't force this if the other person doesn't appear comfortable, but if appropriate, this polite gesture definitely carries value.

Name Tags

Name tags serve a functional role—they help us remember and use names. This is not for our benefit, but also for the guests. Please wear your name tags if you have them.

Seating Help

We've all been in situations where we walk into a room and have no idea where to sit. Offering to assist newcomers in finding a comfortable seat not only helps ease their nerves but also provides an opportunity for a brief interaction that can make them feel seen and valued.

Brief Introduction

A short introduction can go a long way in breaking the ice. Just sharing your name and asking newcomers how they heard about our church can start a conversation and make them feel more at home. If you are unsure if someone is new, I always suggest introducing yourself by saying, "Have I met you before?" That question is relevant whether someone is a first-time guest or if they have been attending for decades.

Guest Services

Don't forget to encourage newcomers to drop by the Guest Services table. This is where they can pick up a small gift, and learn additional information about our church.

In line with 1 Peter 4:9, let's "Offer hospitality to one another without grumbling." Remember, a welcoming atmosphere starts with each one of us. Let's be intentional in our efforts to create a community where everyone feels at home. By extending a warm welcome, we are preparing people's hearts to be more receptive to the Lord and worship. And furthermore, who knows, we might just be entertaining angels unaware.


Women's Fellowship Ministry




Bible Study Opportunities

Accounting For Your Donations Part 6

"Legacy Giving" by John Sproule, Legacy Ministry Chair 2 Corinthians 8:20 & 21

"We want to avoid any criticism of the way we administer this liberal gift. For we are taking pains to do what is right, not only in the eyes of the Lord but also in the eyes of man."

Another element of PWCC's three-year vision plan is to facilitate legacy giving *ANEW!* In 2017, our Church established the "Palm West Community Church Endowment Fund" and earlier this year the Vision Leadership Team accepted all responsibilities linked to the Fund. After review, it was determined that the endowment, as currently structured, lacked understanding, participation, promotion, and shared purpose for the future Kingdom work at PWCC. The VLT deemed it prudent to use the Endowment Agreement as a foundation to build on and to focus "ANEW" on the importance of planned giving. A key step in this re-focus, is the forming of a new ministry called the PWCC Legacy Ministry.

What is the PWCC Legacy Ministry? A legacy ministry's purpose is to facilitate a dynamic planned giving program that allows church members to designate a part of their estate to the church after they die. Planned legacy giving is significant because even though church members often give cash assets regularly throughout their life, only five percent of a person's assets are typically liquid, like cash. The remaining 95 percent is represented in nonliquid assets like real estate, stocks or mutual funds, and retirement accounts. Most of the time, the largest one-time charitable gift a person will make is through their will. By including the church in their estate planning, church members can make gifts through the legacy ministry and those gifts from God shall carry out Kingdom purposes, well beyond our lifetimes.

By prioritizing legacy giving, church leadership shall set in place educational venues that will foster a culture of intentional stewardship and set PWCC for longevity as a ministry.

What is Your Legacy? Whether you are a full-time or seasonal PWCC attendee, we are all ONE in the family of God's Kingdom, through Jesus, for today and future generations. Our PWCC Legacy Ministry provides us all an opportunity to reflect our gratitude for the financial blessings we have personally accumulated. An updated or new estate plan will also reflect your personal dedication to ensuring the future strength and impact of PWCC, as well as our Missional outreach, for generations to come.





Cadence is a ministry we support at the Luke Air Force Base. Bill and Dianne Sperry are the directors of the "Well Hospitality House" serving Airmen (and women) stationed at Luke. Every Tuesday evening Bill and Dianne welcome military personnel and their families to their home for a home-cooked meal and fellowship. As with many bible study groups, Bill and Dianne have become involved in the lives of these soldiers and care for them like family. They are studying from John McArthur's book, "Twelve Ordinary Men", which is a study of Jesus' disciples. On Thursday afternoons Bill holds a bible study for two to four airmen on the book of Exodus. They are also planning a sunrise hike in the White Tank Mountain park for the first week of October. Bill and Dianne's prayer needs are:

- Please continue to keep our Christian Service members in prayer. Pray that God will strengthen them in their faith in Jesus Christ and grant them boldness to share the gospel when opportunities arise.
