





# Accounting For Your Donations Part 8

"PWCC Reserves" by Gary Lanning, Vision Leadership Chair 2 Corinthians 8:20 & 21

"We want to avoid any criticism of the way we administer this liberal gift. For we are taking pains to do what is right, not only in the eyes of the Lord but also in the eyes of man."

Financial stability is a key essential for church growth. Having a financial cushion---cash reserves--- is being good stewards of that which we have been entrusted.

PWCC Reserves: "How much cash should our church have set aside in reserves?"

Starting in January of 2023, various church reserves were consolidated into the following four reserve accounts:

### ♦ Operating Reserve

A church cash operating reserve is not unlike our personal need for an emergency fund. There is a broad spectrum of church cash reserves philosophies. On one end of the spectrum, some say churches should have few reserves because "God will provide." On the other end of the scale, some take the position that 12 months of operating reserves should be maintained. <a href="PWCC leadership has chosen to maintain a minimum of two months and a maximum of three months operating reserves to cover fluctuations in giving and other unforeseen expenses.">PWCC leadership has chosen to maintain a minimum of two months and a maximum of three months operating reserves to cover fluctuations in giving and other unforeseen expenses.</a>

### ♦ Facility Repair & Replace

I would refer you to the <u>Part 7</u> Article in November's PWA for how your church establishes funded depreciation reserve funds for our building repair needs. <u>PWCC currently has R&R funds set aside to cover forecasted repairs for the next two years.</u>

### ♦ Legacy Endowment

Pastor Jim shared, at the last Fellowship dinner, the vision to grow the existing endowment fund, that was started several years ago. John Sproule is the lead for the Legacy Ministry, and I would refer you to John's article in the October PWA, Part 6 in this series. The legacy ministry's purpose is to facilitate a dynamic planned giving program that allows church members to designate a part of their estate to the church to make significant differences in the lives of those who will follow in our footsteps.

### ♦ <u>Vision Reserve</u>

The Vision Reserve is the backbone of our current 3-Year vision. After consolidating multiple reserve amounts into this single reserve at the start of our 3-Year Vision, the Vision Reserve has supported the re-model of Hoover Hall, the building of a new church office, the audio-video and other equipment needs for the Modern Worship venue, the pavers, and benches, etc. for the Pavilion and the ongoing and continuing support for the Modern Worship Director and the back-ups. The Vision Reserve has sufficient funds to support vision venues through the balance of the 3-Year Vision ..... "To Share the Gospel of Jesus Christ ANEW!"

Church leaders plan (*consider Joseph's story about planning for the famine*) and must consider the congregation's cash reserves in terms of heart disposition and kingdom advancement.

### MISSION AVIATION FELLOWSHIP (MAF)

MAF's vision is to see isolated people changed by the love of Christ. Their mission is serving together to bring help, hope, and healing through aviation. They have doctors and missionaries that serve Haiti, Democratic Republic of the Congo (DRC)

in Africa, Dakar, Senegal and South America. On November 4, 2022 one of MAF's pilots was taking supplies to an orphanage in Africa with the help of two So. Africans. They were taking vitamins, over the counter meds, and medical supplies. They were stopped by the police, accused of supporting terrorism and arrested. Our Missions Team has been praying for the pilot, Ryan Koher, and the two men helping him. Ryan's wife and two sons live in Mozambique but went to stay with her parents in Idaho. She was finally able to talk to Ryan via phone in February, 2023. Ryan was finally released in March of this year but must remain in Mozambique for his case is still ongoing. We will continue to pray for Ryan and his family during this difficult time.

### **CHOICES**

As the population of Phoenix grows, so also does the number of women and men who must make a crisis decision regarding a pregnancy and whether or not to seek an abortion. Furthermore, the number of non-surgical abortions has risen dramatically due to the availability of telemedicine and by-mail abortion pills. In Arizona new efforts by propher tion activists are underway to roll back abortion restrictions through a constitutional or



abortion activists are underway to roll back abortion restrictions through a constitutional amendment that would eliminate all restrictions. The goal is to have such an amendment on the ballot in 2024.

The good news is that Choices pregnancy center provides free pregnancy tests, ultrasound, Abortion Pill Reversal as well as baby supplies for new moms and assisting moms and dads with parenting classes. Most of all, the love of Christ is extended through compassionate care, a listening ear, and outstanding medical care.

Through the generosity of the Palm West community, we are able to give financial and prayer support to Choices. The goal of the Glendale Clinic is to remain open at night and on weekends. Please continue to pray for this life saving ministry, for the precious lives of the unborn, and for the women, men and families who come through the doors of Choices. Pray also for the staff and volunteers who face a hostile culture. We will soon be announcing our annual Baby Bottle campaign so remember to save your change! The lives of the unborn are precious indeed.

Since 2016 this mission has made a significant impact on the lives of many children and families here in our own backyard. Some statistics about THRIVE AZ are: 7,500+ new beds given; 10,009 children served; 2,320 preventions; 900 aged-out young adults saved.

There are over **14,000** children in Arizona in Foster Care. THRIVE AZ is helping save these aged-out children...when they turn 18 they may take a plastic bag with all their belongings and are left out on the streets. Many of these children have not grad-

uated from high school, don't have a job, no place to live and no food. Where do they go for help? THRIVE AZ will take a youth in and house, feed, cloth and help them get an education; give them spiritual guidance and direction to be self-sufficient.



THRIVE AZ helps prevent children from being removed from their families due to lack of basic needs and resources. Their goal is to support families in the prevention, reunification, and aged out process to build stability and create hope for a positive future.
