Summer: Don't Let the Change of Pace go to Waste

The four months of Summer always seem to bring about a welcomed change of pace for all of us. The longer days allow us to pack more into our daily schedules, even though our employers try to maintain the steady pace of production that goes on the other eight months of the year. This change of pace effects the life of the church as well. No one has ever attempted to persuade me that lower attendance in worship during the summer months is due to 20% of our members going on vacation every Sunday from the beginning of June to the end of August, so please don't assume that this letter is a chastisement for lack to faithful attendance since the beginning of June. Please read on . . .

Let us think of ways to motivate one another to acts of love and good works. And let us not neglect our meeting together, as some people do, but encourage one another, especially now that the day of his return is drawing near. Hebrews 10:24-25

The following text is used with permission from Dr. David Jeremiah's Daily Devotional on July 11, last month. He writes: The intricacies of the human body are complex, but this we know: The parts are all interconnected—they "talk" to one another so as to maintain balance and health. And since the Bible uses the human body to illustrate the Body of Christ, there is a lesson for us: The more we "talk" with other members of the Body, the healthier the Body will be.

To summarize, just because our daily routines change during the summer, doesn't mean our witness and outreach for Jesus can't change as well.

Dr. Jeremiah continues: "It's natural for Christians to gather in familiar groups based on relationships made in church. But the summer months provide an excellent opportunity to expand our relationships with fellow Christians we may not normally interact with. Opportunities abound for cookouts, picnics, recreational gatherings, day trips, and the like. Gathering together with others, especially those we may not know well, is an opportunity for God to broaden our perspectives and deepen our relationships."

When getting together with familiar friends this summer, broaden your plans to include some new acquaintances in anticipation of God building up your life and theirs. I know I've got a couple of stories to share about the County Fair and our Food Booth. Remember to invite some of you new friends, or perhaps some old friends who haven't been attending church since Covid to joint you for worship in the Fall. You may be surprised at what the Holy Spirit was doing through you when you weren't looking.

The devotional ended with this quote from David Watson, an English Anglican priest, evangelist and author: *Christianity is all about relationships with God and with others.*

Dulcie and I will be traveling quite a bit this summer. At the end of July, we are headed to Hamilton, OH for a week to celebrate Becky's 80th Birthday (Becky is Dulcie's Sister). - Income for the month of June was \$7476 less than budget. Year to date, income is \$49,448 less than budget.
- Expenses for the month of June were \$14,036 less than budget. Year to date, expenses are \$68,348 less than budgeted.
- Net income for the month of June was \$6,747 and year to date we are positive \$19,258.
- Overall, giving is down; however, so are our expenses.

Benefit for Randy Helmrich

There will be a benefit fundraiser for Randy Helmrich on Sunday, July 27th starting at 1 PM at the Ryan Gym in Ryan, IA. A meal and beverages will be served, as well as a live and silent auction.

Randy is a lifelong member of the Ryan and North Linn community. Many know him for his welding talent as he is the proprietor of Eastern Iowa Welding Services. He has kept countless numbers of farmers going all year round with a wide array of different repair issues and innovations to make their life easier.

In December 2024, Randy began noticing decreased funtionality in his hands and arms. After numerous trips to doctors both locally and at the Mayo Clinic, we were left with no real answer, he was offically diagnosed with Multifocal Acquired Demyelinating Sensory and Motor Neuropathy (MADSAM). This disorder presents similar to the symptoms of ALS. His mobility continues to deteriorate rapidly and he is now confined to a wheel chair. He is starting home healthcare and the medical bills are on the rise.

All money raised will help the family with medical bills and travel expenses associated with his continued care.

Mission of the Month (MOTM)

Our August mission of the month for our noisy can offering is the Randy Helmrich Family. Randy was diagnosed with Multifocal Acquired Demyelinating Sensory and Motor Neuropathy (MADSAM).

Randy took part in 2 Mission Projects with First Lutheran. He worked on the Omaha Fence Project, and for the Kansas Fence Project he incorporated equipment to provide ease for those working on the project.

We will be collecting for him and his family on August 10th and 13th. Money raised will help his family with medical bills and travel expenses, associated with his continued care.

Have you heard about Scrip?

Scrip is a great way to earn money for extra projects in our church. We earn profits when cards are purchased at a discount and sold at face value. The profits are dispersed for special projects throughout the year.

Over the years the Scrip program has donated to the Fair Food Stand, Families in need, youth events and other caused, but our biggest recipient has been for our Heaven Bound youth group for service trips.

A check for \$4000 was presented on June 23rd to Alana DeMoss for Heaven Bound's upcoming trip to North Carolina. I want to thank all the people who purchase Scrip and support our youth!
