Letter from Pastor Jason

Typically, when we meet new people two questions are asked: “What do you do?” and “Where are you from?” Well, you all know what I do. I have been a pastor in Iowa for over 21 years but I’m not originally from Iowa. When asked where I’m from my answer is usually, “I was raised in New York, but I’m an Iowan by the grace of God.”

I moved to Iowa in 1994 to attend Grandview University. After one year at GVU, I worked for a summer at Riverside Bible Camp in Story City, IA where I met my first wife Amy. God led us from Iowa to Washington (Graduated from Concordia University, Portland, OR), Nebraska (Hall Director, Midland Lutheran College), Pennsylvania (Gettysburg Theological Seminary) and back to Iowa. My daughter Maia was born in Fremont, NE and now lives in Eagle Grove with her husband Russell (and corgi Rory). My sons Jensen and Evan were born here in Manchester while I was serving my first call in Strawberry Point. Jensen is graduate student at the Iowa studying political science and Evan is a first year Junior at UNI. One year ago I welcomed Abe (Ya-Bo) Lin to our family. Abe was our foreign exchange student from Taiwan and came back this year to attend the University of Iowa.

While serving Eagle Grove Evangelical Lutheran Church (EGELC), Amy was diagnosed with cancer and for six years the congregation supported us with grace until Amy died in July 2023.

In 2024 the folks at EGELC granted me a sabbatical to rest and renew my spirit. Part of my sabbatical plan was to make friends outside of the church for companionship. Having friends to attend concerts, sporting events and just talk with was something I felt was missing in my life. Through the use of social media I met Julie, telling her I had no plans of dating as I would be traveling out of state for my sabbatical etc. However, through phone conversations and a few “outings” I quickly realized she was an amazing godly woman and I consented to dating despite her being an ISU fan (GO HAWKS!).

Julie was born and raised in Vinton, IA and has a fond memory of West Delaware from High School, when their schools regularly played each other. She is a graduate of UNI and has lived and worked in the Des Moines area for over 20 years. Julie has one son, Luke who is 11 and in 6th grade. Both Julie and Luke are new to the pastor family/parsonage life so please be gracious to them. Julie likes to say she met me as just Jason, not Pastor Jason, so she is well aware of my saint and sinner natures.

Julie and I were married January 1st of this year and to say it has been a whirlwind start to married life is no exaggeration. In 8 months, we have “tried” to combine two 4-bedroom homes, move 3 boys to college, and as you know, we are in the midst of moving stuff from Ankeny in Manchester. Julie will be staying at home for at least the rest of this year to get us settled and ensure Luke gets a great start in middle school and breathe a little after being a single Mom for 9 years.
