CONFESSION

- Proclaims Christ as Lord and Savior and head of the Church.
- Demonstrates the ability to apply the gospel to all of life.
- Is committed to grace and truth conversations.
- Teaches truths that align with Baybrook's Statement of Faith.

COMMUNITY

- Lives a life fully engaged in biblical community and is actively participating.
- Seeks to have reconciled and peaceful relationships with those inside and outside of the church.
- Uses spiritual gifts to serve God and others at Baybrook and in the community.
- Gives through tithes and offerings to the ministries of Baybrook.

COVENANT

- Consistently reads and studies the Bible and prays for others and oneself, resulting in repentance and faith.
- Lives a life of personal holiness and consistently participates in corporate worship and the Lord's Supper.
- Practices a healthy rhythm of work and Sabbath.
- To share topics and resources taught in Journey Groups with the Elders.

CALLING

- Consistently prays for and is engaged with others in their sphere of influence.
- Exhibits a missional lifestyle by engaging and serving in the community.
- Supports the Elders and the vision and mission of Baybrook.
