Jesus is The Lamb of God | John 1:19-34

January 11, 2026

Opening Question

1. When you introduce someone, what characteristics do you typically highlight and what kinds of comments do you make about that person?

Study Questions

2. How is John the Baptist introduced to us in 1:19-25?
3. What do you notice about John the Baptist's introduction of Jesus in 1:26-30?
4. What does it mean for Jesus to be the Lamb of God?
Exodus 12:21-28, Isaiah 53:5-6, Hebrews 7:27, and Revelation 5:6-14 might help!
5. In verses 32-33, what three witnesses or pieces of evidence does John provide?
Why is this important to the original audience? *See Deuteronomy 19:15*
6. Why does John say the Spirit *appeared like a dove* in verse 32?

Note: The Spirit has always been in perfect loving union with Jesus (The Son) and God the Father, and this scene of the Spirit descending upon Jesus at His baptism was meant to communicate something special about that special, permanent, Triune relationship and the role of Christ! If you're up for a deep dive, consider the following passages and share how the Old Testament ideas of judgment (Gen 8, Lev 5:7-8) and God's presence (Ex 40:34-38; Lev 5:7-8) inform the dove concept.

Application Questions

7. Which aspects of John the Baptist's example might the Lord want you to integrate into your life this season?
8. What's one thing you can do this week to lead others to the Lamb of God?

Prayer Points

Take a moment to update each other on at least one of the three "i" words on your bookmarks: intentional, invest, invite! Whether it's a name on your group member's list, a step they're taking this week to invest in an evangelistic relationship, or an invitation they plan to extend this week, focus today's prayer time on all that is shared.
