Two Minutes, Forty Seconds.

Did you know that each day, you are getting 2 minutes and 40 seconds more light? And with the start of Daylight Savings Time, we're all getting up an hour earlier, so we get even more daylight. I know this happens each year, but for some reason, this time, it feels magical.

But Pastor, didn't you hear.... we're in a health and economic crisis! That fact sure became real to me this week. A local business owner called me in tears. A homeless man had moved into her laundromat. The disheveled man sleeping in the corner was driving away customers. But that was not her main worry. This big hearted person wept because she had called all around our borough trying to help this stranger, with no response. Finally, reaching the Police Department, they told her to call Bethany Presbyterian Church. I encouraged her, prayed for her and asked around. Soon the visitor, helpless and hungry, was in the church van, on his way to a Pittsburgh shelter. A church staff person and a member who added courage to their compassion were at the wheel. All without violating social distance standards.

But wait, there's more. In my conversation with our good neighbor, I discovered a person carrying burdens too heavy to bear. Income threatened by the virus. Homebound elderly parents, in danger by what she might bring to them, yet with no one else to rely on. She was weeping for much more than one homeless man.

Then a strange thing happened. When I called the first time, there were tears. When I did a follow-up, after her homeless guest was safe, there were even more tears. "Wait," I said. "You were crying, and you're still crying. I haven't done any good here have I." She said, "No. Really, these are tears of joy. I am so happy he is safe and well." Making a difference in this one person, somehow made all the rest of her burdens feel lighter.

Back to the magic. I'm feeling it.

In my pastor/leader role, I have spent much time urging churches to new routines, that bring happier results. It's like the wisdom I read on a senior's sweatshirt, "I put all my eggs in one basket.... Then I lost the basket." Maybe the losing of our basket of routines is releasing some magic among us. Maybe reaching outside of our plan, trusting in God's plan is strengthening our spirits.

Feeling God's moment is like jumping up from the couch and taking a brisk run through the neighborhood, rejoicing in the beating of your heart, and the rhythm of your breath. All of our systems are buzzing with creative thinking. Who knew that in one week we could begin streaming worship? With one pull of the cord, our care network came to life,

completing hundreds of check up calls. Morning prayer inspired by the Psalms, materialized from thin air. 140 people received food while safely quarantined in their cars. For every person needing help, someone offered help. It all feels magical.

I am grateful for the extra hour of wakefulness, and I'm making plans for my extra two minute and forty second gift of light each day. In this time of scrambling, creating and connecting my days seem to be slowing right down to a reasonable pace. The moments are filling with good stories and a feeling that God is at work. It must be the magic.

SECURITY & COSTS - Online and text giving is easy and secure⁽¹⁾. In many ways, it is also more efficient and cost effective than cash and/or checks. Fees for online giving transactions are as follows:

ACH (bank transfers): \$0.25 per transfer – That's the same as the costs to process a check.

Debit & Credit cards: 2.15% + \$0.30 per transaction – This is less cost effective than the ACH option, but there is an option for donors to cover these fees.

(1) Payment information is TLS encrypted and stored at **Stripe** - a Level 1 PCI compliant payment processor. Bank verification powered by **Plaid**.

Regeneration: the New Birth

Scripture Reference: John 3: 1 – 8

The phrase "born again" can call to mind a variety of ideas, memories, and questions. Although some Christians passionately refer to being born again as a specific turning point in their lives, others might perceive it as being a more subtle step in a gradual process of coming to faith. This month's article will show that the new birth is both <u>necessary</u> and <u>instantaneous</u>.

I recently spoke with Bethany PC members Fred Gerstacker and Beckie Price who were raised in strong Christian homes where the love of Jesus and His church were present in them as early as they can remember. I, too, grew up in a strong Christian home and I had similar experiences. Whether there is a specific turning point (like Darren Deemer's moment in church from last month's article), or a subtle change, what matters is that we were 'born again'.

Let's take a moment and remember why we must be born again. Please read Ephesians 2:1-10. To understand the need to be 'born again' we should understand our condition before the new birth. Before the new birth, we were in a fallen condition which means that we were dead spiritually and dying physically. It is a fallen condition we find ourselves in since Adam. See Genesis 6:5. We have died spiritually and need to be 'born again'! We need a savior!

Now let's take a look at John 3:1-8. One of the first words that matters is *unless* in verse 3. *Unless* signals a universally necessary condition for seeing and entering the kingdom of God. Therefore, being 'born again' is an essential part of Christianity; without it entrance into God's kingdom is impossible. Further, in verse 7 Jesus uses another important word – *must*. He says, 'You *must* be born again'. Clearly, it is a <u>necessary</u> condition that must happen for our salvation and entrance into God's kingdom.

Like our physical birth, our spiritual birth happens at a precise time. It is <u>instantaneous</u>. No one can be gradually reborn any more than a woman can be gradually pregnant. There is a decisive moment in which we pass from death to life and from judgment to salvation.

The new birth, is the work of the Holy Spirit upon those who are spiritually dead. In regeneration, God immediately implants eternal and supernatural life within the soul of a man or woman. It is spiritual resurrection as believers are raised from a condition of being dead in trespasses and sins, and are raised to a condition of being made alive in Jesus Christ. In effect, regeneration transforms the person on the inside. The heart has become inclined to God. Please read Ezekiel 11:19 and 36:26; Deuteronomy 10:17 and 30:6. I think Nicodemus should have known these verses. See also Romans 2:29 and 2 Corinthians 3:3.

In regeneration, God plants a desire for Himself in the human heart that otherwise would not be there. We cannot do that ourselves. We do not decide or choose to be regenerated. It is by His sovereign grace that He provides us with this necessary and instantaneous rebirth.


Now chew on that for a while! There is a lot to this and we will look at more next month. I hope in this article we have established that the 'new birth' is both <u>necessary</u> and <u>instantaneous</u>. We will develop these and more sub-topics in next month's newsletter. I will leave you with a definition of the new birth from the systematic theologian and scholar Louis Berkhof.

The new birth is an instantaneous change of man's nature, affecting at once the whole man. It is not a gradual process like sanctification. There is no intermediate stage between life and death. One either lives or is dead.
