

Dear Bethany Friends in Christ,



But when the time had fully come, God sent his Son, ... Galatians 4:4

Advent is a great season of the year. It is the beginning of the church year because it celebrates the "coming" of Jesus, our Lord, Savior and King. Advent means "to come" and it reminds us that Jesus has come, is present, and is coming again!

One of my favorite authors is J.R.R. Tolkien. Perhaps his most notable work is the *Lord of the Rings* trilogy. Now I realize that not everyone is a Tolkien fan, but whether you are or not it is a wonderful story with clear parallels to the biblical narrative. Middle earth is being threatened in a life and death struggle between the forces of evil and an unlikely gathering of seemingly unremarkable characters who literally hold in their hands the fate of the world. Aragorn, the rightful king is not who you would expect but rather one who has dedicated his life to protecting others. Only in this final episode, *The Return of the King*, does he rise to become the fulfillment of so many hopes and dreams that had for so long seemed impossible and inevitably doomed.

As I said, it's a great story, but not the greatest. The greatest story is that though we too live in a world where our ultimate hopes and dreams seem always threatened and in which we lack the power to ensure their fulfillment, their fulfillment is secure. The unlikely arrival of a tiny child in an obscure village, born to the most common of parents, in a world determined to destroy him, only makes it more wonderful that He would be the One who would rise to embody the very promise of God! In a world full of earthly kings and tyrants this child would define the reality of *The Return of the King!* We know Him now as King of Kings and Lord of Lords!

This Advent let's celebrate the return of our king in a way that not only honors His birth but also declares His presence today and His glorious return in the fullness of time! The King is Coming! Come, Lord Jesus!





MISSION TEAM -DID YOU KNOW?

Washington City Mission



The Washington City Mission is our largest Mission recipient partner. They are a faith based homeless shelter campus in Washington, PA whose sign says "Jesus Saves". They are dedicated to providing hope, healing, and support to individuals in need in the Southwestern Pennsylvania area. Their mission is to shelter, to heal and to restore the homeless to independent living without discrimination by providing food, shelter, case management, biblical based counseling and life-changing programs. Their approach is through Compassionate Care, Life-Changing Programs and Community Outreach.

The Campus has four shelters for their residents and these include the Men's Shelter with 90 beds, a Women with Children Shelter, the Crabtree-Kovacicek Veteran's House and the newly built and dedicated Sally's Sanctuary which is a 50 bed Women's Shelter. In addition, they provide emergency shelter for both Men and Women. Their Community Outreach includes the Samaritan Care food pantry which offers food and clothing assistance for low-income individuals and families, the WECare Street Outreach which provides free medical care, food and other resources to those living on the streets and their Medical Clinic that provides acute medical care and bridges primary care services. In 2024, they provided 84,912 meals, 47,288 nights of shelter, 14,319 medical clinic visits and served 1,453 individuals. Their success rate was 69% for the residents who stayed 90+ days with 129 obtaining jobs and 150 moving into their own homes.

As Sally's Sanctuary is the new addition to the City Mission Campus and just opened in September, we wanted to highlight it in this article. This 50-bed facility was built because the City Mission recognized two years ago that there were not enough shelters and beds for the growing population of homeless women. With its completion, the City Mission can now house over 209 residents in their 4 buildings. Diana Irey Vaughn who is now the President and CEO of the City Mission and a former Washing ton County Commissioner has been key in raising money (\$180,000 since 2016) for this facility and the whole campus through her long distance charity runs. She was a volunteer at the Mission before becoming President and CEO and said, "It's about loving people back to life."

This facility was a collaboration between Rothschild Doyno Collaborative and a pre-construction team led by women. The goal was for the space to be grounding and peaceful and to help women feel celebrated. Each floor has a washer and dryer and a large community space with lots of natural light and the second level features a shared women and children's courtyard space with a playground. The third level has a balcony with rocking chairs for relaxation and reading. The first floor of the Sanctuary includes a childcare area that was designed with the Children's Museum of Pittsburgh and includes details like the bubble mirror along one wall. It also includes Matt's Maker Space which provides children with the opportunity to explore STEAM (science, technology, engineering, arts and math) related projects. Each bed includes a handmade quilt with a patch containing a bible verse and the name of the person who made it. Many include the name of Wendy Hopwood and other volunteers who made them in the memory of Wendy's son, Adrian Foody, who died n May 2024. The goal is for the women to be wrapped in warmth and love from the community. In addition, each bedroom wall includes an inspirational affirmation mounted in gold frames such as, "And for wherever you are on the journey, light will meet you there."

In summary, the Washington City Mission through its resident facilities and community outreach programs is providing hope, healing and support to individuals in need in our area. They are always looking for volunteers to help at their warehouse or seven Thrift Stores in our area and also will take donations at any of these locations. MFI flies missionaries, their families, and household effects to and from the field. MFI also transports work teams and their equipment for short-term ministry. MFI receives mail and cargo for mission work that the staff handles with care and delivers as soon as possible.






Confirmation Class Coming Soon!


Bethany Presbyterian Church is excited to announce that we will once again be offering a Confirmation Class starting in January of 2026 that will be open to all current eighth and ninth grade students. For the next few weeks, we will be working on the finishing touches to this program and will be ready to start at the beginning of January 2026. We will hold regular classes through April, and students will be confirmed in May 2026.

What is Confirmation Class? The word confirm, from the Latin confirmare, means "to strengthen." At Confirmation, the Holy Spirit and the church's prayers strengthen those who are being confirmed. This strengthening includes preparing youth to 1) profess their personal faith 2) declare their intent to take part actively and responsibly in the church's worship and mission. For those not baptized as children, Confirmation includes both Baptism and a profession of faith!

The only exception to this rule would be for contributions that are mailed and postmarked in 2025. These contributions would be deductible in 2025 even though the contributions were not received until 2026.

Christmas Eve Services will be 5:00 and 7:00pm! 5pm is our Family service and 7pm is Candlelight Sunday, Dec. 28 there will be one service at 10:00am!
