The Bridgeville Community Food Bank is needed now more than ever. For our April 18th distribution we assisted 105 families which included 48 children, 84 adults and 76 elderly. An additional 18 families were helped with emergency provisions.



- Crestfield Slippery Rock, PA— As of 4-20-20 Crestfield is still planning on-site summer camps.
- **Ligonier Camp Ligonier, PA** As of 4-20-20 still prayerfully discerning whether there will be on-site 2020 camps. Developing a refund policy that reflects the uncertainty of the time. More info will be available on their website after May 1.
- New Wilmington Mission Conference Virtual in 2020— The conference has decided to go digital for this year. More information will be made available on their website as details are worked out. This is a great "camp" experience for people of all ages (attendees range in age from weeks old to adults in their 90s!) Regeneration: the New Birth

Scripture Reference: John 3: 1 – 8

While my fishing guide was gently polling our boat toward some giant tarpon, out of nowhere he asked me a rather obscure Biblical question. Being caught off guard, I answered that I was not an expert on eschatology (end times theology) but that I would give him an answer when I got home. I have known this guide for about 12 years and as we discussed the Bible he told me he wanted to read it. So I sent him Ligonier's *Reformation Study Bible* along with a reading guide when I got home. Hmmm....was he born again? Time will tell. His subsequent text messages were encouraging. In this month's article we will see clearly, I hope, that the new birth is both <u>supernatural</u> and <u>scriptural</u>.

The physical birth of a baby is an occasion for excitement and joy. However, a spiritual birth into the family of God is a greater cause for celebration. Knowing Christ is the greatest experience in life. Being used by God to help others know

Christ is the second greatest experience in life. I love telling you about my experience with my fishing guide!

Now let's read John 3:3 focusing on the word 'again'. The Greek word for again is *anothen* and it has a two-fold meaning. This word can mean "again" and it can mean "from above". The use "from above" can be found in John 3:31; John 19:11; James 1:17 and James 3:15,17. When translating "born again" we can understand its meaning as (1) a second birth and (2) a birth from above. This birth from above comes vertically from God acting upon a human soul. It is a <u>supernatural</u> birth that accomplishes what a natural birth cannot. Human tradition, religion, morality and effort cannot bring about the new birth. Now read John 3:6. Jesus emphasizes the difference between a natural birth of the flesh, and a <u>supernatural</u> birth by the Spirit.

Words carry power and the Word of God wields a power unrivaled by any form of human communication. No one is born again independent of the Word of God. Thus, the new birth is a <u>scriptural</u> birth. The Word of God must be planted within the human soul and God must sovereignly tend that seed to bring forth life. Nicodemus addressed Jesus as "Rabbi" which means teacher. Jesus taught by sowing the seed of scripture in the hearts of His listeners, including Nicodemus. Read Romans 10:17. Now turn to Luke 8:5-15, noting that Jesus goes into detail about sowing seeds in various human hearts. Consider 1 Peter 1:23-25. What is important to believers in these verses is the fact that we are **not** born again of perishable seed but of imperishable seed. We are born again through the enduring Word of God. We are born again to eternal salvation.

Turn now to James 1:18. What should be clear in this passage is that the *will* of God is the *cause* of regeneration and the *Word* of God is the *means* of regeneration. A harvest of human souls is the *result* of regeneration.

Finally, one of my favorite examples of both a <u>supernatural</u> and <u>scriptural</u> regeneration is what happened to two men walking with Jesus on the road to Emmaus. Their hearts burned as the scriptures were opened to them by Jesus. Please read Luke 24:13-32.

Now back to my fishing. It sure seemed to me that the Holy Spirit was working in the heart of my fishing guide coupled with his desire to read the Bible! Seemed like a <u>supernatural</u> and <u>scriptural</u> new birth to me! Truly amazing! Worth praying about!

As an aside, I hooked two tarpon, one well over 100 pounds, but I am a neophyte tarpon fisherman and I failed to land either of those two fish. There will be a next time! God is great and so is His creation! To wrap this up, consider the following from John Piper, a contemporary and popular Baptist pastor from Minneapolis, MN.

God makes the Word his instrument in the new birth, and the way the Word works in the new birth is by awakening faith.
