While the moment is brief, it is a profound explanation to children readers of what Holy Week is about. The Pevensie children have met this unsafe, but profoundly good Lion, and know that something is wrong. Over the course of Lent and throughout the year we meet this man Jesus, and we marvel at him. He too is not safe but is good. He challenges us. He tells us we are blessed. We know that we are loved, it is enough. But during this Holy Week, we know that something is not right. The triumphal entry into Jerusalem was supposed to be the start of the restoration of the kingdom of David, but it ends with Jesus looking around the temple (Mark,) cursing a fig tree (Matthew,) weeping over Jerusalem (Luke,) or confused disciples (John.) None of it makes sense, which is why every year we walk with Jesus just as the Pevensie children walk with Aslan. Jesus does not want to be alone this week and neither do we. We walk with one another through the streets of Jerusalem, we wonder why Jesus says the things he says, we are appalled that this savior who ushers in a kingdom of peace, is violently put to death, but we know that it is not the end of the story. The stone will be rolled away, the tomb will be empty. Christ is risen, he is risen indeed!

And here we are, able to walk together this year. We do so safely and without judgment. It was just one year ago that all of were trying to make sense of the world we were living in. plunged into isolation by necessity and unable to do so many of the things that we would normally do in Spring, including celebrating the resurrection of our Lord. Yet, we are here now, with vaccinations on the rise, and a rising sense of hope. We will celebrate Easter together. It will still be different and not what we are used to, but it will be good. It is such a blessing to me to be the pastor of this church, experiencing every day what God is up to in our neighborhood, and the amazing ways we join Him in that work. IN GRATEFUL PRAISE



God is Spiritual

Everywhere in the Old and New Testament, God is represented as a spiritual Being, without form, invisible, whom no man hath seen or can see; dwelling in the light which no man can approach unto, and full of glory; as not only the creator, and the preserver, but as the governor of all things; as everywhere present, and everywhere imparting life, and securing order. – Charles Hodge

Scripture Readings: John 1:18; John 4:23–24; 1 Timothy 1:16–17. Hymn: Immortal, Invisible, God Only Wise by Charles C. Smith

God is spirit and does not have a material body (John 4:24). In order to reveal Himself, God uses figurative language so that we can more easily understand who He is. The Bible speaks of God's hands (Jer. 18:6), eyes (2 Chron. 16:9), arms (Isa. 53:1), and ears (Ps. 130:2). Several times the Bible talks figuratively about meeting God face-to-face (Gen. 32:30 and Exodus 33:11).

Consider that God's lack of a physical body is not a limitation but rather part of what makes Him the divine Lord of all. Without a body, He can be present in all places at all times – never subject to spatial constraints. It is precisely because He has no body that He is able to keep His promises to be with us His people (Matt. 28:20; Heb. 13:5). The very fact that He is spirit, gives us assurance that wherever we go, and no matter how alone we may feel, God is with us.

While some people claim to have seen God, the truth is that He is invisible (1 Tim. 1:17). The only physical manifestation of God in human form is Jesus Christ – the God-man (John 1:18; Col. 1:15). We know God through revelation in three distinct ways:

- 1. We can know about God by examining the world He has made. Known as general revelation, God demonstrates His glory through all of the created universe (Ps. 19: 1–2; Rom. 1:19–20).
- 2. We can know God by reading what the Bible says about Him. This is special revelation.
- 3. Finally, we can know God by entering into a relationship with Jesus Christ (John 1:14).

As a spirit being, God is infinite and has no boundaries or limits. His being permeates every part of time and space. As finite beings, we just can't understand a God who transcends time and space. The fullness of His being, which is beyond our comprehension, should bring us to our knees in wonder and amazement. This mystery of God ought to increase our sense of worship of Him. It is at this point we begin to understand what is meant by an almighty God!

Personally, I get great comfort worshipping and serving an almighty God. A God who is far superior to man and a God with incomprehensible attributes! God must be that way and I want nothing less! I love that about God! Does this high view of God give you comfort as well? If so, why?

Christians have been given a faith by an invisible spirit God. This faith has us looking forward to heaven with resurrected bodies and souls and a glorious face-to-face meeting with our God!
