### from our Serior Pastor

I love a late Easter. There I said it. Easter has always followed a lunar calendar (I won't get into what that means,) but I wish whoever was in charge would just choose the 3rd Sunday of April and have done with it. Don't get me wrong, I know there are many historical/theological reasons for the way things are. I just love a late Easter. There are many reasons for this, most of which have to do with my childhood. I loved a late Easter when I was younger because I loved the beauty of Springtime. I loved the warmer weather. I enjoyed wearing shorts to Grandma's for Easter dinner. As I have gotten older, I remain a fan of a later Easter, but my reasons have changed.

There is something to be said for a longer period between Christmas and Easter. There is more time to reflect on the life of Jesus, more time to spend in Scripture, looking at his miracles, his teachings, who Jesus really is. I have

always believed myself to be hurried when Ash Wednesday comes in January. "It is not time yet," I think to myself. There are very real implications to Jesus being with us, Christ the Immanuel. A later Easter allows us time to come to grips with that. By walking with Jesus and seeing who he is and what he does, we create space in our lives to deepen our relationship with him and create space for healing.

I think a lot during Lent about Jesus' miracles and what they mean. I know there are miracles of a great catch of fish and miracles of more food than 5,000 people can eat. But it is the healing miracles that always amaze and perplex me. They amaze because, well, they are amazing. A paralytic man is dropped in front of Jesus, and he heals his sins and his paralysis; a blind man has mud and spit rubbed on his eyes, washed it off, and is healed; a foreign woman screams at Jesus to heal her daughter and he relents. But I always wish for more. I don't want Jesus to heal a blind person, I want Jesus to heal blindness! I don't want Jesus to let one person walk, I want Jesus to consign wheelchairs to the dustbin of history! The fact that this is not the case reminds me that even Jesus pointed to something beyond himself. Each healing miracle points to the day when God's kingdom will come to Earth, this Earth, and all will be healed.

Even those who were healed had to move in a broken world. The man healed of blindness could see but would have to come to grips with visible injustice that still existed. The one whose paralysis was healed would now be able to run to those in need themselves. Healing includes wonder, but also the beautiful and difficult aftermath. A later Easter creates more space for healing.

As we move towards Holy Week, I hope we are able to experience this as a Healing Week as well. We travel a road together, and that road leads to a cross, but the road is not a journey taken alone. Healing is a community event. We name what we need healing from and we come into contact with those who have been healed and need healing themselves. We walk the road to a cross; it is difficult. We experience the joy of an empty grave; It is wonderful!

### from our Associate Pastor

On Saturday, March 19th, I had the opportunity to teach about one of my greatest passions, Global Prayer. I started with the quote by a famous American missionary named Samuel Zwemer who said, "The history of missions is the history of answered prayer. Everything vital to the success of the world's evangelization hinges on prayer."

As a class, we walked through several of the amazing resources available to us, including books, websites, podcasts, and apps, that help us pray for different countries, churches, and people groups. We specifically looked at Operation World (OW), widely regarded as the definitive volume of prayer information about the world. Each day, OW provides a different country, region, or group of countries for which to pray – including statistics on the church, unevangelized groups, majority religions, and even things like Bible translations.

We specifically learned about the country of Brunei, which is located on the northern coast of the island of Borneo – with the South China Sea to the north, and Malaysia to the south. Many of us were surprised to hear in this country, "the constitution guarantees religious freedom, but it is illegal to evangelize and illegal for a Muslim to convert to another religion. The Christian church exists under very difficult conditions. Evangelism is illegal, importing Bibles and Christian literature is illegal, and no foreign Christian workers are permitted there."

In addition, we learned about the 10/40 Window, which is located from 10 degrees south to 40 degrees north of the equator, and includes 69 nations across northern Africa, the Middle East and Central Asia. Nearly 4 billion people live here, including 90 percent of the world's poorest of the poor. It is estimated that 1.6 billion of these people have never had the chance to hear the Gospel of Jesus Christ – not even once! The seat of every major non-Christian religion – Islam, Buddhism, Hinduism, Animism, Atheism, and Sikhism – is headquartered in the 10/40 Window.

Hopefully, the more we here at Bethany can learn about the needs in our world beyond what we see on the news, the more specific we can be in prayer about the global church. These prayer points include the unreached peoples and the continued need to send and support missionaries in the most remote places of the world. Prayers and blessings abound, *Pastor Ellen*

# The Grace of God BY: DOUG BOVARD

Faith is a living, unshakeable confidence in God's grace; it is so certain, that someone would die a thousand times for it. This kind of trust in the knowledge of God's grace makes a person joyful, confident, and happy with regard to God and all creatures. - Martin Luther

Scripture Readings: I Cor. 15:10; Titus 3:4–7; Rom. 11:6; Rom. 3:24; Eph. 2:8,9; 2 Tim. 1:9; Ex. 33:19; 1 Tim. 2:5, Rom. 5:15; and 2 Cor. 3:18.

Asked to summarize the law Jesus said we should love God and neighbor. God's grace should help us keep this commandment. As we learn about God's grace toward us, it should flood our hearts with gratitude and love for Him. This grace should provide a model for how we treat our neighbors.

God's grace and goodness are part of His glory. Our God delights in pouring out abundant grace upon us. He freely shows unmerited favor and free grace to the lost, to those ruined in sin and to those who seem so undeserving. No one affects us more than God. It should excite our hearts to witness and be the recipient of this abundant grace. We should hunger to know more about a God so full of goodness and grace. This undeserved grace should compel us to be very thankful and move us to a deeper and more sincere worship of Him. In this month's article I will try to explain God's incomparable grace.

God's grace is free. What does God's free gift of grace mean? Please read Romans 3:23,24 and 11:6; Eph. 2:8,9; 1 Cor. 15:10; Titus 3:4-7 and Romans 11:6. The gospel of Jesus Christ is a gift that God gives. God's free grace means that you can't earn it, it is undeserved, unmerited, and it can't be bought or sold. It must be received by faith. As Romans 3:24 states, we are justified before the judgement seat of God based solely on the perfect righteousness of Jesus Christ. It is a substitutionary atonement and with our spiritual rebirth we are declared the perfect righteousness of Jesus Christ who accounts to us, recons to us, imputes to us, His perfect righteousness. It is received by grace on God's terms, not ours. Our justification before God is not a reward for the righteous, but a free gift for the guilty. God does not give us what we deserve, He freely gives us what we don't deserve. Those who claim to be righteous will never have it, and only those who declare their own guilt may receive it by faith. Jesus has not come for those who are well, but for those who are sick. Like oil and water, grace and works can't be mixed. Truth is, we are all sick and need God's grace and Christ's righteousness.

God's grace is eternal. Please read Romans 8:28-30 and Eph. 1. Before time began, God planned to give His grace to His elect. The elect were not chosen on the basis of what they would do, but were chosen according to God's own purpose and grace.

God's grace is sovereign. God is under no obligation to choose and be gracious to anyone. No one has a claim on the grace of God because it's given by God according to His will and to those who are undeserving (Ex. 33:19).

God's grace is far reaching. It is extended to the lives of people all around the globe (Titus 2:11). This includes men and women, Jews and Gentiles, slave and free, educated and uneducated, rich and poor, and people from all languages and cultures.

God's grace is mediated. God's grace is mediated through the Lord Jesus Christ (1 Tim. 2:5). There is no salvation outside of Jesus Christ (Rom. 5:15). Christ is fully God and fully man, and Christ alone can represent man to God and God to man. To have Christ is to have everything; not having Christ is to have nothing.

God's grace is saving grace. God's grace saves believers from God Himself. Apart from His grace, mankind can only expect God's judgement and wrath. We are saved by God, for God, from God.

God's saving grace is super-abounding. There is no amount of sin that God's grace cannot overcome (Rom. 5:20). God's grace is transformative. By it, He transforms believers into the image of Christ (2 Cor. 3:18).

How should a consideration of God's free and sovereign grace influence Christian worship? How should it affect Christian relationships? Reflect on the first time you became aware that salvation is purely a gift of God's grace, apart from any works. How did you respond to God? Did you ask 'why me Lord'?
