"Keep Your Fork!"

Dear (New) Friends in Christ,

As I write this article, I have been at Bethany for all of 1 week! Your welcome has been a blessing and I am very much looking forward to knowing you all better.

In my brief time here I'm learning a lot about how you (we) think about church. I've met folks who've been here forever and those who are relatively new but the recurring theme is that Bethany is a wonderful place to grow in faith, build great friendships that can last a lifetime and where your gifts can be shared for God's glory. One thing, Bethany sure likes to eat! My very first day was the "Golden Oldies" luncheon! What a joy to be with some of you and so many members of the Bridgeville community. If people find out coming to Bethany is that much fun the building may not be big enough.

Perhaps our motto should be, "Till we eat again!" This reminds me of a story I heard years ago and you may have already heard.

I think it really applies to this new chapter in Bethany's story.

A woman knew she had only a short time left to live and she called her Pastor to make arrangements for her memorial service. She told him which songs she wanted sung at the service, what scriptures she wanted read, and what dress she wanted to be buried in. She also requested to be buried with her favorite Bible in her left hand. Everything was in order and as the pastor was preparing to leave, the woman suddenly remembered one final request that was very important to her. "Please Pastor, just one more thing", she said excitedly. "Sure, What is it?" came the pastor's reply. "This is very important to me," the woman continued ... "I want to be buried holding a fork in my right hand." The pastor gazed at the woman, with a loss for words. "That surprises you, doesn't it?" the woman asked. The pastor replied "Well, to be quite honest, I'm puzzled by the request."

The women explained. "You see, Pastor, in all my years of attending church socials and potluck dinners, I remember that when the dishes were being cleared after the main course, someone would invariably lean over to me and say, 'Keep your fork'... it was my favorite part because I knew that something better was coming, like velvety chocolate cake or deep dish apple pie---something wonderful, and with substance to end the great meal."

The pastor listened intently, and a smile came upon his face. The woman continued, "So, I just want people to see me there with a fork in my hand and I want them to wonder... 'What's with the fork?'...then I want you to tell them, "Keep your Fork... the best is yet to come."

I've only been here at Bethany for a brief time and I still have so much to learn about the people and the ministry of the church, but I can't help but feel that the best days are still ahead! So be sure to "keep your fork" as we move forward into the future the Lord has already prepared for us.

## MISSION TEAM -DID YOU KNOW?

### **Bethany Church Diaper Bank**

Bethany Church has a monthly Diaper Bank that started in March of 2019 – which puts us in our 6<sup>th</sup> year of helping those in need of diapers including Moms, Dads and even some Grandparents with a package of diapers and a package of baby wipes. Our doors are open for everyone. It all started after Barb Crawford attended a World Wide Presbyterian Women's Convention. I attended a class where the lecture was about Diaper banks and different ways they operate and help all moms in need. It touched my heart deeply (I couldn't imagine not having diapers for my baby) and so many moms cannot afford to purchase them (and they sure are expensive) thus, all the way home I thought continuously and prayed about how we could make this program happen here at our home church and well, 6 years later with Gods help, we are still going strong! We try to keep our packages between 30 and 40 diapers. This is done on a monthly basis on the 4<sup>th</sup> Saturday of each month – 12 months a year – from 9:00AM until Noon. There are two of us at the back door. Lynne Suchoza is a regular along with Barb Crawford and Heather Lucas has been our substitute helper, and even Jack Crawford and Mike Suchoza have helped us out!! We pass out anywhere between 15 packages at the lowest to almost 50 packages at the highest monthly. (My heart says even one package during that time period for a little one would make our day)!! Tim Anderson also passes out diapers and wipes for those in need coming to the Food Bank on the 3<sup>rd</sup> Saturday of each month.

Whenever we started, we required a WIC card, name and address and recipients were required to come into the church and up to the Welcome Center to fill out their paper work. Whenever COVID hit, we decided to eliminate any requirements and moved down to the doors at the back of the church. We now have a sign on the brick wall letting participants just drive up and we go outside – ask what size they need, get their diapers and wipes and take them back outside to them. Occasionally there is an uplifting note for moms and also a book for the little one put in their bags. Word of mouth sends families to us and several times we have sent letters to Churches in our area and posted signs at the Bridgeville and South Fayette Libraries. We are supported by Bethany's Mission Team and also from donations of all sizes of Diapers, Pull-ups and baby wipes from our Church Family, along with monetary help. For several years now the Upward Basketball families have brought diaper and wipe donations to our diaper bank. Please always be sure to let those in need know we are here if Diapers and Wipes are ever needed!

Confirmation Class is BACK starting in January 2026 for current 8th and 9th grade students. More information is coming soon!




## Stewardship Concert

During the October 18th Food Bank distribution, 100 families were assisted which included 40 children, 71 adults and 76 elderly.






## CONDOLENCES
