Adult Classes offered at Bethany this Fall-

Life Together - led by, Associate Pastor Ellen Dawson

This will be a 4 week class starting on Sunday, September 25th. The class will focus on the reading and discussions based on the book entitled *Life Together* by Dietrich Bonhoeffer.

Women's Bible Study - led by Becky Yanak

The Women's Sunday School class will begin meeting Sunday September 11 at 9:30am in Room 224 – the old choir room. We will be discussing the book, *Unveiling of Mary Magdalene*. Bible Study in the Chapel - led by Mark Rackley

Within this class, the primary study will feature the book of James. It will open with James 3, Taming the Tongue, and move on for about 6-8 weeks. Please note, the first two chapters were previously completed in the Spring.

Once the book of James is completed, a group decision will determine which part of the Bible will be explored next.

New Testament Class - led by Doug Bovard and Fric Gregory

The purpose of this class is to read through the books of the New Testament. The authors, dates, genres, literary features, themes, theology, history and interpretation are just some of what we consider. A study Bible with footnotes and concordance is helpful and can be provided if needed. Presently, we are reading the book of John. We spend 4 to 8 weeks on a particular book depending on content. Weekly reading of 2 or 3 chapters is followed by class discussions, brief lectures, videos and Q&A sessions. All are welcome!

Bible Study on the Gospel of Mark - Led by Devin Underwood and Sharon Salvini

Join us as we take a journey through the Gospel of Mark, following the earthly ministry of our LORD. As we travel to the town of Nazareth, around the Sea of Galilee and into the heart of Jerusalem, we will explore Mark's portrayal of Christ as the "Suffering Servant," and learn how we can apply the lessons of Christ in our modern world.

Serior Pastor.

For all the talk of becoming a great athlete in my younger days, there are really only two things I ever seriously considered doing with my life. One, I now do for a living, and the other has become a hobby. We are surrounded by giants, few of whom we ever meet, but they are known to us still. For those of us who study history our giants are not just the subjects of our study but the men and women who write. They have names: Fields, Donald, Schlessinger, Brands.

While none of them would ever want to eclipse their subjects sometimes it happens.

One of those giants passed away this month. David McCullough, the brilliant historian, and narrator of such documentaries as Ken Burns' "Civil War," was a native of Pittsburgh and gained notoriety for his first book about the Johnstown Flood, and great fame for later works on Harry Truman and John Adams. I cannot read his books without hearing his voice. One thing I have always tried to do in my life is to tell the truth, and not just the truth as I see it, but truth that is tested by inquiry and discussion with others. McCullough taught this, which is why his books are so compelling. In a lecture he gave later in his career, he noted that too often we treat our founding fathers as gods or at least god-like. In response McCullough said,

"...nor were they gods. Indeed, to see them as gods or godlike is to do disservice to their memories. Gods, after all, don't deserve a lot of credit because they can do whatever they wish. Those we call the Founders were living men. None was perfect. Each had his human flaws and failings, his weaknesses. They made mistakes, let others down, let themselves down. Washington could be foolhardy and ill-tempered. Adams could be vain, irritable; Jefferson evasive, at times duplicitous."

McCullough demonstrated that history did not need to remain the preserve of academics. Academic historians have their place and are needed. However, history should never be reduced to mere statistics, assumptions, or narratives. History should consist mainly of the very thing that gets kids interested in history to begin with, stories. McCullough says further in the same lecture, "There should be no hesitation ever about giving anyone a book to enjoy, at any age. There should be no hesitation about teaching future teachers with books they will enjoy. No harm's done to history by making it something someone would want to read."

Ever since I made, with God's help, the move from historian to pastor and preacher, I have tried to tell stories. I am blessed that *the* story I get to tell is the greatest one ever told, the story of Jesus. This is our story, and we tell it by how we live. It is one thing to tell others that "Jesus saves," and quite another to demonstrate this in the story of our lives, and the story of our church. Fall is a wonderful time for storytelling. Kids run home from school with stories to tell. Parents sit at dinner tables and ask the family how their days were and will not allow responses of "fine" to suffice. Do not keep your stories to yourself, they are too precious, and too little told. Tell a loved one, a relative, a stranger. Your story matters for it is, in some small way, the story of God. You are created in His image, and God's story, your story, is a page turner.

Moni pingo onse! This is a greeting to a church congregation in Chichewa, the official language of Malawi. Malawi, known as "the warm heart of Africa," has had a place in the heart of Bethany Church for 15 years. A partnership between Pittsburgh Presbytery and the Synod of Blantyre of the Church of Central Africa (CCAP) has allowed our congregation to encourage, support and learn from our brothers and sisters, specifically those at the Chiradzulu CCAP congregation in Southern Malawi.

Since the partnership was formed, over 500 people from Presbyterian churches in the Pittsburgh region have traveled to Malawi—and an equal number of Malawians have been hosted here in our city. The visits have involved relationship building, medical mission work, outreach programs, and educational events such as the New Wilmington Mission Conference.

The main purpose of the visits and the partnership as a whole is to encourage each other in life and in faith as an extension of God's love and grace through Jesus Christ. We do this through learning, praying, worshiping, and growing together as the Body of Christ.

The Pittsburgh Presbytery is thrilled to be offering an opportunity to travel to Malawi, and Bethany Church would love to have a few members on that team. The trip leader, Rev. Ted Martin of Hampton Presbyterian Church shared, "The real reason we are going is so that we can see firsthand how our international partners are doing ministry and how we can support them better."

The Malawi Team will spend time at a Mission Conference Center in Blantyre. Groups will go for visits to their sister churches, including experiencing hospitality in people's homes. A few days of rest and recreation will be included in the itinerary with plans for a visit to Lake Malawi and possibly go on a safari.

Is God calling you to be a part of this wonderful opportunity? If you are interested in learning any more of the details, please contact myself, Carl Suppo, or the trip leader, Rev. Ted Martin. I've heard nothing but amazing stories of joy-filled worship, warm hospitality, breathtaking sunsets, and the movement of the Holy Spirit from people I know who have visited our brothers and sisters there.

Also, please note: you may not be called to actually travel there in March, but if you'd like to be on a prayer/support team for any Bethany members who feel the call to go, let me know. I'd love to help you discern and surround these team members with encouragement.

The Mission Team is ready to offer financial support to cover some of the trip costs, too.




