Guardian Angels Medical Service Dogs

Guardian Angels Medical Service Dogs, Inc. is another of Bethany Presbyterian's Mission Partners. It is 501(c)3 nonprofit organization whose mission is dedicated to rescuing, training, and donating highly skilled service dogs to empower individuals with disabilities to lead more independent lives, while easing the burden on caregivers. They provide life-long partnerships, offer integrated mental health and life coaching support through nationally certified professionals for the recipients and their families. The recipients include veterans, first responders, and individuals with disabilities, including PTSD. traumatic brain injury. mobility issues, seizures, diabetic disorders and hearing impairment. In addition, they also offer life-long support, including a Medical Savings Plan that covers veterinary care, ensuring both the recipients and their service dogs receive the highest standard of ongoing care. By promoting education, scientific research, and public awareness, they advocate for best practices in service dog training and fight discrimination against individuals with disabilities, creating a more inclusive society. Although it costs between \$25,000 to \$30,000 to train and support each dog, with the exception of a \$70 Application Fee, the recipients are never charged for their dogs.

Guardian Angels Medical Service Dogs was founded fifteen years ago in 2010 by Carol Borden. She was the daughter of a disabled Korean Veteran and grew up to be the mother of a disabled Iraq/Afghanistan veteran. With nearly six decades of dog training experience, she has gained recognition among the most respected figures in this industry and has provided service dogs to 430 recipients as of September 2024. The service dogs are trained under her prestigious college-accredited and VA-approved curriculums and have been accepted to work inside the Pentagon and other Department of Defense facilities in addition to providing the life-saving assistance to those in need. She has earned numerous national awards for her organization's work under her leadership in mental health and suicide prevention and also the top award from the Department of Labor for her dedication to also hiring veterans. Each day 22 veterans lose their lives to suicide. When paired with a service dog from Guardian Angels Medical Service Dogs, the number has dropped to zero.

Although Guardian Angels Medical Service Dogs is based in Florida where Mrs. Borden resides and has provided dogs to recipients in 33 states, it has a close connection to Pittsburgh. They have paired over 40 dogs in southwestern Pennsylvania and quite a few more have been sponsored in this area including some by the Steelers and Pirates. For this reason, they chose Pittsburgh to build the country's first state-of-the-art service dog training facility. The 102-acre campus located near McDonald, PA, will serve as the northeastern headquarters for Guardian Angels.

The infrastructure of this facility will begin this summer with the first building being erected in the fall. The Welcome Center will be the gateway to the campus and will be the building where daily operations such as recipient training, foster family instruction, events, apprentice classes and volunteer coordination will take place and also house the offices. The facility will be built in stages and in addition to the Welcome Center will include training facility housing for the disabled recipients during their pairing, on-site housing for the highly trained dog care specialists, the Borden Institute of Higher Learning for teaching of animal-related careers, the Borden Veterinary Training Hospital and dog housing facilities including a nursery. A diagram of entire facility and a picture of the Welcome Center are included below.



The Guardian Angels Medical Service Dogs is sponsoring the national virtual Mutt Strutt from October 10th to October 22, 2025. You can register at their website (https://www.medicalservicedogs.org) to enter and either walk solo, with your dog or with a group. They suggest mile options of 1 mile, 2.2 miles or 22 miles (represents the 22 daily veteran suicides) and you can walk anywhere. Every step and dollar help to fund a service dog.

The following is a story from Craig, a recipient of a Guardian Angels Service Dog. Craig was a US Marine Veteran who faced numerous challenges after his service. He was paired with a beautiful service dog, Foxy in 2020 and because it was during Covid-19 the Guardian Angels team came to Western PA to conduct the training. Foxy has given Craig the strength and confidence to navigate daily life and returned his life to a new normal. She is his companion, his confidente and his lifeline. In 2021, Foxy was selected as the Guardian Angel's Service Dog Hero Dog of the Year. Foxy was chosen because she used her skills and training to awaken Craig one night when the building they were in caught fire. He was in a deep sleep from his medication and was awoken by Foxy as she jumped up and down on his chest and licked his face. They were both able to escape the building safely.

From our Music Director



Originally from Frederick, Maryland, **Caleb Auldridge** recently moved to Pittsburgh after graduating from Duquesne University with a bachelor's degree in sound recording last May. Caleb's musical and choral journey started in elementary school, where he first joined his school choir. Later, in middle school, he began to learn guitar and participated in the Maryland All-County and Junior All-State choruses for all three years. At his high school, the Barbara Ingram School for the Arts (BISFA), Caleb took private classical voice lessons and studied music theory. He sang in the BISFA Chamber Choir for all four years, as well as in the "Triple Threat" musical theater group. He was the understudy for Sam in the musical "Mamma Mia!" and played the lead role of Lucas in "The Addams Family."

Throughout high school, he was selected for the Maryland All-County and Senior All-State choruses each year, and he also sang in the National Association for Music Education (NAfME) All-National Chorus in 2018, 2019, and 2020. Caleb continued his musical education at Duquesne University, studying sound recording technology and continuing private vocal lessons. While at Duquesne, he was a member of the Mary Pappert Voices of Spirit chamber choir under the direction of Dr. Daley, as well as the Recording Studio Ensemble, which focused on commercial genres such as funk, rock, and pop under the direction of Alexander Price.

a. As the author, Joseph Pipa explains, he wrote this study book to train Christians in the basic doctrines and practices of Biblical Christianity. The

studies (26 total) are a series of inductive Bible studies keyed to the Westminster Standards – including the Shorter and Larger Catechisms. In addition to the WCF, there are parallel readings in the Belgic Confession, The Heidelberg Catechism, the Canons of Dort and the Presbyterian Book of Order. Plenty of scripture references and memory verses. The author estimates that each study takes about one and a half to two hours of home study.
