Acts 22-23 Paul's Open Door in Jerusalem

NOTES

Acts 22:1-21 Paul's arrival in Jerusalem – *be ready and willing to share your testimony!*

- 1. Paul started his testimony with his Jewish lost background in a way that connected him to his audience.
- 2. The key to Paul's testimony was how he met the Lord Jesus Christ and how he surrendered to Jesus Christ as Lord!
- 3. Paul ended his testimony by sharing his life priorities from God AFTER salvation.

Acts 22:22-23:11 Be of good cheer – when one door closes, press forward!

- The Jews gave Paul audience for a time, but when he spoke of the Gentiles, they became irate and child-like.
- 2. Paul was always aware of his surroundings and chose to use his Roman card and Pharisee card when necessary.
- 3. After much fleshly persecution, Jesus Christ Himself (the living Word of God) came to encourage Paul.

Acts 23:12-35 No matter how bad things in your life appear to be, trust God.

- 1. The very day after Paul was comforted and encouraged by Jesus Christ Himself, more than forty Jewish men made a conspiracy to kill Paul.
- 2. Paul's nephew a young man overheard the conspiracy and was used by God to help Paul and send advance warning to the chief captain.
- 3. The chief captain ordered a rescue operation of almost 500 soldiers and armed men to escort Paul to plead his case before Felix the governor of Caesarea.

- 2. Have you taken ownership of the Gospel ministry personally? Are you ready to advance the Gospel?
