





Subject: Reflecting on "The Rich Man and Lazarus" - A Call to Eternal Perspective

Dear Church Family,

I hope this email finds you well and still reflecting on our recent sermon.

Summary: Our sermon explored the parable of the Rich Man and Lazarus from Luke 16:19-31. This powerful story highlighted the contrast between earthly wealth and spiritual riches, emphasizing the eternal consequences of our choices in this life. We discussed how our treatment of others and our faith in God shape our eternal destiny, reminding us that material comfort does not guarantee spiritual security.

Takeaways:

- Earthly status doesn't determine eternal standing: The parable shows a dramatic reversal of fortunes after death, teaching us to prioritize spiritual wealth over material possessions.
- Our actions have eternal consequences: How we treat others, especially those in need, reflects our faith and impacts our relationship with God.

God's Word is sufficient for salvation: Abraham's response to the rich man emphasizes the importance of heeding Scripture as our guide to faith and righteous living.

As we move forward this week, I encourage each of you to reflect on your own life choices and priorities. Are we living with an eternal perspective? How can we better align our daily actions with God's will and show compassion to those around us?

May God's wisdom guide us as we seek to live faithfully in light of these eternal truths.

conversation, every act of service, and every corner of Venus.




Wednesday Night Kids (WNK)

You have the update from the mission trip to Honduras, and I thank you for putting that update together and again for all the prayers while I was away and getting me home!

September was a busy month of missions around the metroplex. North Texas Giving Day was a blessing. I had the opportunity to share at a few local churches to speak about the mission and fundraise. I ask for continued prayers for those that will help with monthly sponsorship. I do not need the funds. I am raising to sew directly back into the kingdom both here in the states and abroad. I am so thankful for those of you that contributed to the mission after I spoke, but also to have surprise notes show up in the P.O. Box with encouragement and donations, was a wonderful surprise blessing. I consider you my church home; I have not been attending this month so that I could speak for other Sunday School classes and groups. Thank you for your faithfulness to check in with me and pray!

We are already having donations for prom dresses pour in, and they are beautiful. I am learning that junior highs in Arlington are having more dances, and many do not have nice dresses to wear, so we donated several dresses to help neighboring girls at local junior highs. Last Wednesday was Joe and my wedding anniversary, but we had a surprise request from a nonprofit in AZ requesting to help two stranded Hondurans. So, MHR put them up in a hotel and took them to dinner. It was so much fun to have them and Tyler at our anniversary dinner. We took them to Saltgrass, and one had never had a steak and the other woman had only had a T-bone from Denny's, so it was a blessing to show them how Texas makes steak and sweet Tea.

^aDeclare His glory among the nations, His marvelous works among all the people." Psalm 96:3. God's greatness is not to be confined to one group but shared with everyone. This verse urges believers to be active witnesses, spreading God's word to every corner of the world. On October 19, we will be honored to welcome Billy Carruth as our guest speaker. He will be sharing with us his mission work in West Africa. He reports that" the Lord has given him many wonderful victories this past spring. It is a very busy time in West Africa for ministry. From late May to September is the rainy season, so travel is restricted. "In Niger and Sierra Leone, he adds, they've had a very significant number of churches planted. They've taken the teaching of church planting to new areas of the country. The Lord has opened doors to the new unreached tribal people. In Sierra Leone, they went to Kabala and Kono where church planting movements had started among the Koronko and Kono people. In these two areas alone, there are twelve churches. The new church plants have grown from 42 to 84 over this past year. He asked that we continue praying to lift Niger up to the Lord, as conditions on the ground are getting worse with government restrictions and radical Muslims gaining power. They are conducting several training courses with growing movements in each country. Billy Carruth is doing amazing work. To God be the glory! We look forward to hearing more about his mission work Oct. 19th. Let's be a church that prays without ceasing for continued support of missionaries worldwide.

Our support for ministries and mission work is vital to the growth of God's Kingdom. Please be active in reaching out to them. All contact information is available in the mission's area. We pray Lord to help us be a people that joyfully go out of our way to impact lives and bring glory to You. Let's be senders for the Simmons family and bless their upcoming mission work in Ecuador next summer. Thank you for contributing to their heartfelt mission work. A donation box is located on the missions table. "You will do well to send them on their way in a manner worthy of God For they went out for the sake of the Name, accepting nothing from the Gentiles. Therefore, we ought to support such men, that we may be fellow workers with the Truth." 3 John 6-8. Soon we will be placing Christmas cards and envelopes on the missions table. Support for these faithful servants to the Lord is especially important throughout the holidays. Remember, international mail takes some time, so sending it should be at least a month ahead. Consider sending a family photo and information about Christmas activities. This is a reminder to them that their ministry is making a difference. A list of addresses and email info is on the missions table. Thank you for your service to the Lord. May the peace and grace of Jesus be with you always.
