Church Council

Present: Diane Menchhofer, Pam Rasawehr, Ed Fuelling, Moriah Plattner, Pastor Becky Erb Strang, Jennifer Barrett, Matt Gilmore

Opening: Diane Menchhofer called the meeting to order. Ed Fuelling presented a devotional for the meeting.

Support Pastors' Reports: Pastor Becky Erb Strang stated May 2025 reports from herself and Pastor Deb Monnin have been submitted for Council to view.

Pastor Becky stated that she and Pastor John Mobley have been asked again by the Lake Festival committee to lead the Lakefest Sunday service on July 27th at 10:30am. As such, she requested that the 10:45am contemporary service on July 27th be cancelled and to invite people to attend the lakeside service. Pam Rasawehr motioned to accept the service adjustment. Moriah Plattner seconded; motion carried.

Pastor Becky reported that she has been asked to mentor Pastor Randin Jello - the pastor of a new Marshallese Church in the area with 50-75 members. Currently, the church is without a permanent home; Pastor Becky is assisting Pastor Randin with trying to obtain a loan through the UCC for funding a location to permanently establish. Pastor Randin asked if Pastor Becky could request Council if the Marshallese church could temporarily use the Family Life Center. This request was presented during April's Council meeting; the request was declined at that time. Matt Gilmore stated did not think this would be permitted under the Synod though will verify.

Committee Reports: Pastor Becky Erb Strang and Moriah Plattner presented a report for the Worship Committee. During the meeting, concerns were raised about miscommunications leading up to the combined service during Memorial Day weekend. Diane Menchhofer proposed adding a notice to the blue worship insert with the known dates for upcoming altered services: June 29th combined 10:30am service for the Mission Trip Report, July 6th combined 10:30am service for Independence Day weekend, July 27th 10:30am service at Lakefest, August 31st combined 10:30am service for Labor Day weekend, and December 28th combined 10:30am service as the Sunday following Christmas. Ed Fuelling and Pam Rasawehr mentioned seeing notifications sent to the congregation of June 15th being a combined service, but that date was never approved for being a combined service. Therefore, the insert will also communicate a correction that services on June 15th will be at the standard times of traditional worship at 9am and contemporary worship at 10:45am.

Moriah stated another concern presented during the Worship Committee was about the altar candles and the sacristy. Joann Plattner expressed concerns of multiple people - and not members of altar guild - directly adjusting the battery-operated altar candles instead of using the remote or seeking Joann in the event of a problem. One of the candles has become faulty as a result of the intermeddling. Joann has been searching for a replacement set of battery-operated candles; unfortunately, manufacturers appear to have stopped making the needed size for the altar. Joann stated Don Trisel approached her last Sunday to inquire if the battery-operated candles could be changed to oil or wax candles. Joann has oil candles that once an adaptor is received - will work on the altar. However, she expressed that years ago Pastor Jeff strove for battery-operated candles as a safety measure due to potential fire hazards. Moriah stated Joann would like the input of Council on whether to use oil candles permanently for the altar or to try to switch back to battery-operated candles once a new set becomes available. Council expressed they would trust Joann's judgment for the altar candles and leave the decision to her. Furthermore, concerns were expressed by Council of individuals outside of altar guild members meddling with the altar without Joann's knowledge. Diane Menchhofer encouraged signs to be placed by the altar candles stating to contact Joann in the event of any problems or concerns. The Council stated that actions

concerning the front of the church should go through Joann as Head of Altar Guild and is willing to support Joann as she requests. The next Worship Committee meeting will be scheduled at a later date.

Pastor Becky reported the Community Outreach Committee met to discuss upcoming events for the Fall. Events discussed were the Annual Church Campout at Lake Loramie, North Star's Fall Festival on September 21st, and a campfire event on August 23rd. The next Community Outreach Committee meeting is scheduled for June 17th at 6:30pm.

Business Manager's Report: Don Trisel (not present) submitted the financial report for May. The financial report showed giving was 5.02% less than budgeted for May and expenses were 6.23% less than budgeted. Therefore, the net income for May ended up in the positive. Ed Fuelling motioned to accept the financial report. Jennifer Barrett seconded; motion carried.

President's Report: Jennifer Barrett updated Council on the progress of improving the church calendar for better communication. Both David Barrett and Ingrid Tebbe reported to Jennifer that the solution is possible though complicated due to needing to coordinate multiple platforms - each necessary in its functioning. They expressed hoping to move forward with improvements soon.

Old Business: Jennifer Barrett stated that Sherry Krieger of the ELCA met with staff members to check in on how our church is doing amidst our CALL process. Sherry stated there has not yet been any applicants to pass on.

Council also discussed the Heffner Endowment Grant that was voted upon through email. Council members would like to ask Don Trisel if line items for next year's Heffner Endowment Grant could be presented sooner to allow more time before making a decision. New Business: Due to circumstances, the church office is temporarily closed with a notice stating that individuals may drop a note in the lock box beside the office door or speak with Don Trisel or Ingrid Tebbe with concerns. Moriah Plattner expressed concerns for visitors of the church being able to find their way to either Don's or Ingrid's offices due to lack of signage to indicate the way. She suggested a sign - whether temporarily or permanently - be hung on the four-way corner by the coat area that could assist visitors with finding their way to routinely used areas of the church.

Diane Menchhofer stated in the past a flyer was presented to the congregation on the different ways members could financially give to the church. She suggested creating a smaller version of the ways to give - complete with QR code - that could be laminated and fit in the pews where the gray cards are located. Moriah suggested having a couple cards per pew in case someone wanted to take a card home for ease of giving there. Council expressed the giving cards as a good idea to try and should be fairly simple to create since there already exists a template for the proper size with the gray cards.

Next council meeting is scheduled for June 23rd at 6:30pm.

Executive Session: Council entered into executive session for approximately 45 minutes.

Adjournment and Prayer: Diane Menchhofer called the meeting to adjournment. The meeting concluded with the Lord's Prayer.
