DISCUSS

God desires us to obey and trust Him with our lives. Has there been a time when you had a plan for something to happen and it didn't turn out that way? Mary had to trust God's plan for her life, not knowing what was going to happen next. Are there places in your life where you have difficulty saying yes to God? Where do you sometimes struggle to obey what God tells you to do?



During a census, Joseph and his fiance, a very pregnant Mary, made a long journey across Israel on a donkey to Joseph's hometown of Bethlehem. When they made it into the village, Mary went into labor; however, there was no room at the inn for them to stay. Mary gave birth to Jesus in a dirty barn filled with animals and hay. She wrapped him in cloth and laid him in a manger -- what a humble, simple beginning for the Savior of our world! This was not an unfortunate turn of events, but exactly the way God planned the arrival of His only son, Jesus. Sometimes God's work goes on quietly in hidden places. As Paul tells us later in the New Testament, God emptied Himself, taking the form of a lowly servant... for us!

DISCUSS

Jesus wants to make Himself permanently at home in our hearts. He doesn't want us to wait for a more convenient time, but right now, right where we are. Is there room in your heart for Jesus? How do you crowd Jesus out of life? Do you say it by your choices that there's "no room"? What are ways you can lower or empty yourself for Jesus and other people to take on a servant's heart?



After Jesus was born, an angel of God appeared to a field of young shepherds tending their flocks. The angel shone brightly with the glory of God but told the shepherds to not be afraid, that the angel brought the shepherds good news! In the town of Bethlehem, the Savior of the world had been born. Shepherds were often poor peasants without much social influence but God choosing these humble shepherds to be the first to receive the good news of Jesus' birth was so important. It meant that the great and glorious God decided to stoop down to Earth to become one of us, a human, to meet us in our lowly broken humanity.

DISCUSS

If you had been a shepherd, would you have been frightened by the angel's message? Why do you think the shepherds were the ones selected to visit Jesus? How can this story change how you view people in your everyday life? Is there anyone you quickly dismiss, or don't pay attention to, and how can you change your behavior towards these people in the future?



A group of wise men, called magi, traveled from the East to find the new king of the Jews. They followed a bright star in the sky to come and worship this king. However, the jealous King Herod tried to trick the magi into telling him where this new king was but God warned them not to say. When they found baby Jesus, they fell to their knees. The wise men came to worship Jesus as King. Jesus is the King who will rule forever, as God promised to King David in 2Samuel 7. Jesus is the true King who is worthy of all our worship. The magi presented him with rich, beautiful gifts of frankincense, gold and myrrh, offering these most precious treasures to the new Savior of the world.
