MISSION IN FOCUS GLOBAL WORKERS THROUGH SIM NIGER

This weekend we are privileged to have 5 of our global friends with us who work in Niger, Africa with SIM. Niger is one of our Strategic Focus Areas that we have been praying monthly for since 2008.

It is our joy and honor to stand with them as they serve in this challenging environment. Their contributions help strengthen SIM's work among the Fulani and Tamajaq peoples. We are convinced no one should live and die without hearing the good news. Yet, more than 17 million people are living and dying without Christ in Niger today.

Prayer Requests

- Pray for the Fulani and Tamajaq who have responded to the gospel, for courage to remain faithful to Him despite opposition from families and society.
- Pray for more Tamajaq and Fulani to be evangelists to their own people. Pray for protection for those already involved in evangelism and discipleship.
