Amid my life's most difficult season, I came to a saving faith in the person and work of my Lord and Savior Jesus Christ. My passion for the Lord and desire for biblical knowledge, understanding, and wisdom caused a pleasantly insatiable craving to draw nearer to Him; however, I was not equipped with the necessary skills to efficiently and purposefully learn about Jesus, His Scriptures, and practical application.

Fortunately, Every Man A Warrior (EMAW) provides me the framework to learn and hone skills that enable me to interpret and understand God's Word. One of the best features of EMAW is the fellowship with other like-minded men. I have formed several strong, deep-rooted connections with outstanding men of God who offer encouragement, accountability, and brotherly love. Another gift in this journey has been learning the rhythm of quiet time—a simple, structured way of sitting with God's Word. At LC3, we are blessed to see God's faithfulness woven through the lives of our families—and sometimes that faithfulness becomes beautifully visible in the next generation.

Dustin Kinney, age 18, grew up in our church, attending the elementary ministry when it was still called Promise Land. As a kid, he watched his mom, Neilia, faithfully serve—helping children learn Bible stories, memorize Scripture, and see Jesus' love lived out each week.

Today, Dustin is following in her footsteps. Now a young adult, he serves regularly in our elementary ministry, leading kids with joy, patience, and enthusiasm. This past summer he even stepped into character as Joseph in Egypt, helping children understand God's faithfulness through Joseph's story. Dustin says his heart for serving comes

from watching his mom's example—and now he gets to pass that same love for God's Word to the next generation.

Recently he shared this experience: "One weekend I was leading the kids' large-group lesson in Elementary. We had over 50 kids that service, and most of the helpers in the room were high schoolers and middle schoolers. It made me realize how well our church has disciplined the younger generations. They aren't serving because they have to—they serve because they want to. It's amazing to see how much God is moving in our church!"

Dustin's story is a reminder that spiritual investment matters. When parents and adults step into ministry, kids notice. They remember. And often, they grow up to do the very same.

As we continue to pour into our children, we invite parents and adults to join us in shaping the next generation of believers. Your influence—your presence—could be the spark that encourages a child to walk faithfully with Jesus for a lifetime.

God is at work in our church family, from one generation to the next. Let's continue the legacy together.

Recently Pastor Tung taught about Jonah, a prophet who thought he could run away and hide from God. I have heard the story of Jonah and the whale all my life, along with the story of Daniel in the lion's den, and David slinging a stone into the forehead of the giant. These are amazing stories of real people that God used to accomplish great things. But it wasn't until I took Perspectives for the first time that I realized the purpose of these adventures was more than keeping kids enthralled in Sunday School. The real reason God showed His power was so that His name would be known among the nations. Consistently throughout Scripture God is working to reveal His name, character, and love to all the peoples of the world. And He is still doing just that—to all 8.1 billion people on this planet. And of those people, 3.5 billion are unreached with the Gospel, with no access whatsoever to the Good News.

"Hudson Taylor's words, 'For what service I was accepted I knew not; but a deep consciousness that I was no longer my own took possession of me, which has never since been effaced,' really resonate with me. It seems that was the start of Taylor's journey into glorifying God. I feel mostly the same: I know not what service God has for me, but I have head knowledge at this point that my life is not my own and I desire to use it for His glory, although I daily struggle to convince my flesh of this. I desire to trust God and go on an adventure with Him as Taylor did, but even that trust is a work in progress. Praise God for His grace and patience with a slow learner like me! And praise God for courses like Perspectives that is helping me along."

It's been over 9 years since I wrote these words. Since then, I've watched God lead me into one unexpected adventure after another—serving with LC3's Global Local Outreach team, launching ESL classes in Muslim homes and at LC3, building friendships with Muslim women, learning Arabic, helping resettle Afghan families, walking alongside persecuted believers, and sharing the Gospel with women across the Middle East through technology. Most recently, He's opened the door to serve those detained at the ICE Processing Center in Tacoma. Perspectives was the springboard for all this fruit, and I look forward with joy to whatever kingdom work He has ahead. "If I am to live in the flesh, that means fruitful labor for me..." (Philippians 1:22).

From Whipping to Salvation

Over the summer, one of our Mission Teams held our very first one-day VBS outreach in Mangochi—at Hope Community Church, our church plant in a predominately Muslim city. While the team was acting out a Bible story, a disturbance broke out. A young Muslim man had been sent by his parents to retrieve his three sisters who were attending the VBS. He forced his way through the crowd, grabbed the youngest girl, and began dragging her away—striking her face and legs with a thorny stick. Passion staff and local deacons quickly stepped in to protect her and calm the situation.

Even as the outreach continued, the deacons stayed with the young man, gently talking with him until he agreed to return to the church and observe the rest of the program. When the crowd later divided into small groups, this young man—Cassim—chose to join a circle of other young men. He listened closely as the gospel was shared. When the invitation to receive Christ was given, Cassim raised his hand along with the others. All of them met with Pastor Edwin afterward, who encouraged them to come to church on Sunday. Though Cassim has not yet returned—likely because he was only visiting family—pastor and deacons continue to pray for him by name.

This moment highlights the challenges Hope CC and our other church plants face in predominately Muslim regions, where every follow-up must be done with care for the safety of new believers and seekers. Recently, two members who began home Bible studies in their neighborhoods were evicted after their landlords learned what was happening.

Please continue praying for Hope CC and our partner churches as they walk through persecution and spiritual opposition—and pray that the seeds planted will bear lasting fruit. To God be the glory!

Rescuing and Celebrating at The Chikondi Infant Home



Meet the newest addition to the Passion family: Chisomo, which means “Grace” in Chewa.

She was named by the nurses at the hospital when this beautiful baby was found abandoned in a toilet and rescued by someone who heard her crying. She was brought to the hospital, where the staff reached out to Passion Center at first for formula and diapers. It was when our nurse took those items to the hospital she was made aware that the Zomba government workers wanted to ask us to take her into the Chikondi Infant Home when the hospital discharged her. What an honor to be trusted by city officials for such a role!

Chisomo is just a few weeks old, but we can’t wait to watch her grow up surrounded by love. We thank God for the events that led to her rescue. She makes the 11th infant at Chikondi, and we can see we need a larger place and one that is also our own. Praise God that He is allowing us to join Him in rescuing Chisomo and hopefully many more through the Chikodi Infant Home.

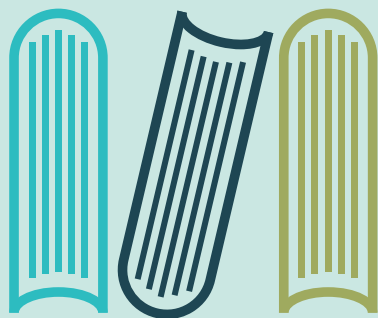

Unexpected Friendships

My journey into ministry at the Tacoma ICE Detention Center began this past April with simple window visits. A friend from English with Friends (an LC3 ministry) told me about several Chinese men who spoke little English and had no visitors. She handed me a list of names, helped me navigate the process, and soon I found myself speaking with a young man—Chen—through a thick pane of glass and a telephone. He had been detained for eight months without a single visitor. At first, he was cautious and unsure why I wanted to meet him. All I could offer was friendship, conversation in my rusty Mandarin, and, at the end of each visit, a brief prayer.

One week, Chen asked if I would visit his cellmate, Bai. Soon I found myself meeting both men weekly—listening to their stories, praying with them, and sharing the Gospel using Chinese

Scriptures I had memorized 40 years ago when I first lived in Taiwan. God brought those verses back to mind word-for-word (we are not allowed to bring items to the window visits). Eventually, Bai asked Jesus into his life, and Chen began asking deeper questions about faith.

As the weeks went on, relationships deepened. My granddaughter joined one visit, and her presence touched Chen profoundly, opening the door for more spiritual conversations. Through their Saturday church services at the DC, Chen and Bai introduced me to another believer, Lin, and by mid-summer I was discipling all three men.

In August, I began serving inside the Saturday volunteer church ministry. Now I sit with groups of Chinese men for Discovery Bible Study, joining volunteers of many languages as we witness God transform lives. Just this past weekend, 36 men and women were baptized, representing diverse nations and stories.

Many in the DC remain alone, hungry for the love of Christ and the salvation found only in Him. Some will return to the U.S., others to their home countries—but each carries the potential to share powerful testimonies of God’s grace.

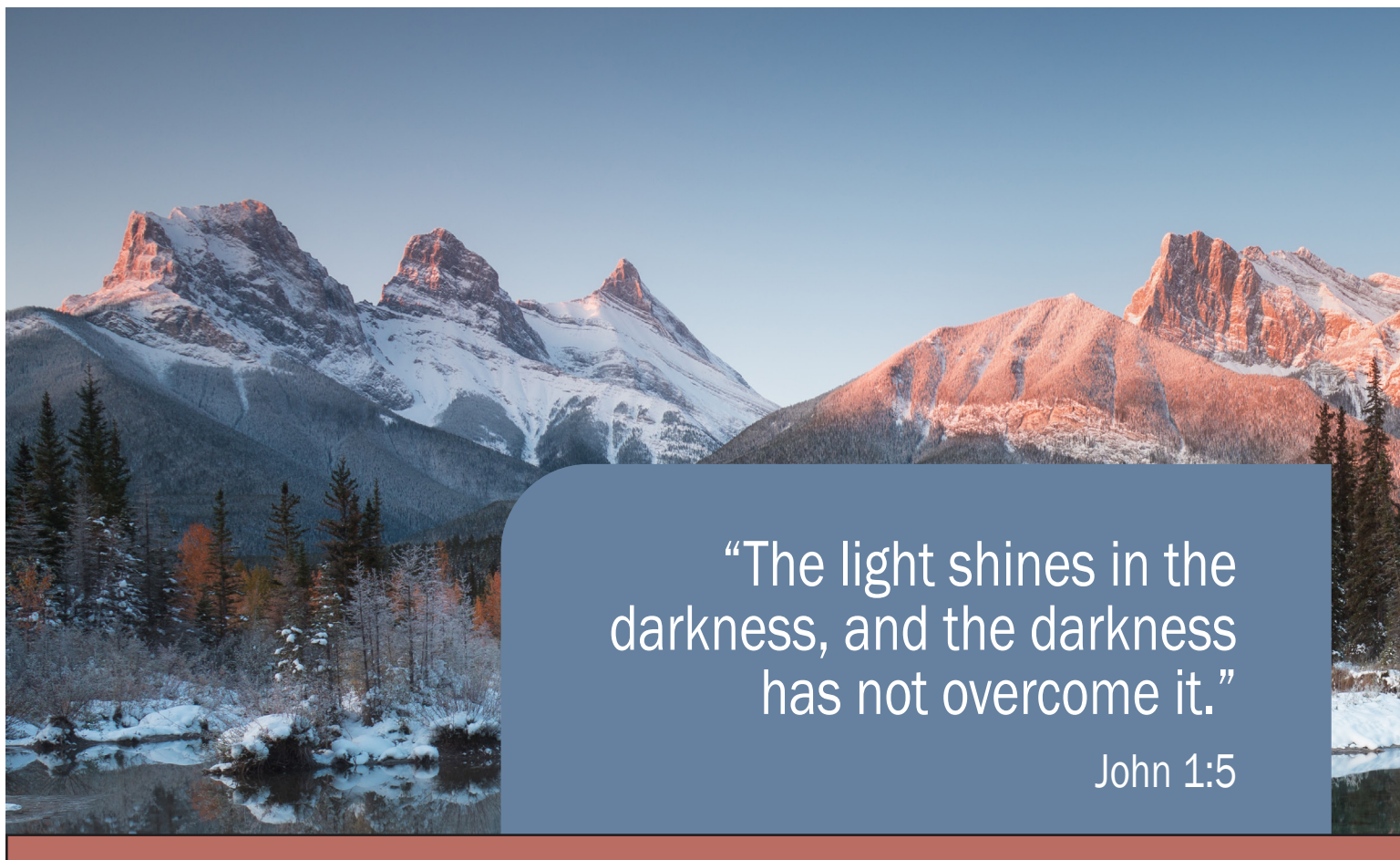
