NEW! Pastor Art Klausmeier Celebrates 60 Years in Ministry



On June 30, 1965, Art Klausmeier began serving the Church as a Director of Christian Education and Youth Ministry at Zion Lutheran Church, Schenectady, New York. This call began a long journey in ministry that also included 10 years as a teacher at Emmanuel Christian Day School in Baltimore, Maryland, and long tenure at Emmanuel Lutheran Church in Fort Wayne, where Art served as Director of Christian Education from 1977 until 1982 when he was ordained and installed as Associate Pastor at Emmanuel. A year later, Pastor Klausmeier was called to serve as Senior Pastor at Emmanuel, a position he held until 1998, when he accepted the position of

Grant Advisor at The Lutheran Foundation.

After retiring from The Lutheran Foundation, Pastor Art returned to Emmanuel's staff as Pastor Emeritus, assisting with hospital and shut-in visitations at Emmanuel along with providing pulpit assistance at Emmanuel and at Peace Lutheran Church in Fremont. During his "retirement" Pastor Art also served on the Board of Directors of Lutheran Senior Care Ministry, including a six-year stint as Board President.

For 60 years, the Lord has used Art Klausmeier as a minister in His Church and Emmanuel has been richly blessed through his service. Please join us in thanking God for Pastor Arthur Klausmeier. *Soli Deo Gloria*!
