
## **NEW!** Pastor's Bible Study Online

#### **NEW!** 2026 Stewardship Commitment

On October 25 and 26, Stewardship Commitment cards were distributed in our worship services with the instructions to return the commitment cards during November in the offering plate.

As you consider your family commitment for 2026, incorporate these suggestions:

- 1. Receive God's gifts. If you have not been faithfully attending worship to hear God's Word, receive His forgiveness, and partake of His body and blood for the eternal benefit of your soul.
- 2. Pray. Go to the throne of grace and ask for the Lord's guidance.
- 3. Consider what the Church does. The Church is called to spread the Good News about Jesus Christ by preaching the Gospel to all who will hear it and administering the Sacraments to the faithful. This is our mission, and the mission is for the life of the world.
- 4. Examine yourself. Are you:
  - a) giving of your first fruits that is, does your offering come out of your paycheck first, not just what's left over;
  - b) giving voluntarily and cheerfully;
  - c) giving systematically and proportionally in a generous way;
  - d) relying on God's promise to provide for you?
- 5. Decide on your commitment. Now you are ready to consider what proportion of your income you will give faithfully, proportionally, generously, and cheerfully.
