As we pause and reflect, may the joy of Christmas be ignited in our hearts once again. Sit back, relax, and enjoy the read.

Christmas is a season filled with the fragrance of evergreen trees, peppermint, freshly baked cookies, and all kinds of treats. We decorate trees with lights, tinsel, and ornaments, little reminders of Christmases past. 

LAUNCHING SPIRITUAL DRONES

Drones are frequently used in warfare and by police. They provide surprise and sudden attacks. One major advantage of drones is the fact that they make precision strikes. In addition, drones are used to gather intelligence and for surveillance.

God also has drones, in the spiritual sense. He has means to strike demonic enemies in a sudden manner. When God launches these sudden strikes, the enemy is disabled. There are numerous biblical examples of enemies becoming confused and even fighting each other after a strike by heaven.

It is to our advantage to stay one step ahead of the devil. We can use spiritual drones to defeat spiritual enemies! Our prayers can provoke angels to actions. Our prayers can bring unexpected warfare against the demonic forces. Our praises can scatter the enemies.

Certain scriptures confirm the concept of sudden spiritual drones released into action for effective spiritual warfare.

"Let the saints be joyful in glory: let them sing aloud upon their beds.

Let the high praises of God be in their mouth, and a two-edged sword in their hand;

To execute vengeance upon the heathen, and punishments upon the people;

To bind their kings with chains and their nobles with fetters of iron;

To execute upon them the judgment written: this honor have all his saints.

Praise ye the Lord" (Psalm 149:5-9 King James Version).

KING HEZEKIAH

King Hezekiah received a threatening letter from the king of Assyria. The letter was sent by a commander named Rabshaketh. King Hezekiah took this letter to the Lord. He spread it before the Lord, and he prayed to God!

"Incline Your ear, O Lord, and hear; open Your eyes, O Lord, and see: and hear all the words of Sennacherib that he has sent to taunt and defy the living God" (Isaiah 37:7 Amplified Study Bible).

God answered the king's prayer by sending a message from Isaiah, the prophet.

"Therefore, the Lord says this concerning the king of Assyria. 'He will not come into this city or shoot an arrow there, nor come before it with a shield or raise an assault ramp against it" (Isaiah 37:33).

God sent a spiritual drone against the Assyrian army. An angel of the Lord went out and struck 185,000 men that very night. When Sennacherib saw his army struck dead, he left and lived at Ninevah. (Isaiah 37: 36, 37)

The prayers of King Hezekiah released a mighty force from heaven!

THE SWORD OF THE LORD AND GIDEON

With just 300 men, Gideon defeated a mighty army of the Midianites. God gave Gideon divine instructions for this battle. The weapons of Gideon's army were also unusual. Each man was given a trumpet and a pitcher. The men were divided into 3 companies. Each company was positioned in a strategic manner for the surprise attack upon the enemy.

"When Gideon's men blew the three hundred trumpets, the Lord set the sword of one (Midianite) against another even throughout the whole army: and the army fled as far as Beth-shittah toward Zererah, as far as the border of Abel-meholah, by Tabbath" (Judges 7:22).

CONFUSION was the spiritual drone sent against Gideon's enemies.

When Gideon's men blew their trumpets and smashed their pitchers, a spirit of confusion fell upon the Midianite army.

JESUS CONCEALED HIMSELF

Often Jesus found himself facing angry crowds. The Pharisees confronted Jesus about the topic of Abraham's descendants. They accused him of being of the devil. (John 8:44) The response that Jesus gave brought them to great rage.

"Jesus replied, "I assure you and most solemnly say to you, before Abraham was born, I Am (John 8:58).

They picked up stones to throw at Jesus, but Jesus concealed Himself and left the temple. (John 8:59)

A spiritual drone hid Jesus from the sight of those who tried to harm Him. God can hide us from the hand of the evil one. When we pray this prayer of David, we release the spiritual drone of HIDING His people.

"For in the day of trouble He will hide me in His shelter; In the secret place of His tent He will hide me" (Psalm 37:5).
