The Christmas season was kicked off for the IPHC with the annual **Harvest Train** at Falcon Children's Home. Many gathered from around the country to be a part of this special day. Falcon Children's Home has been operating for over 100 years and has changed thousands of lives, providing homes for children who, for whatever reason, are unable to live with their parents.

The Harvest Train offering is a special offering taken up every year on the Tuesday before Thanksgiving. Churches and individuals bring monetary gifts and commodities to help with the ministry of the children's home. Women's Ministries from across the nation come together to sponsor the Harvest Train and bring donations that have been collected by the various conferences.

The day begins with a parade throughout the town of Falcon that allows everyone to see what God is doing through this ministry. Children decorate their houses and banners, using a special theme for the year. The banners are voted on by the Women's Ministries Team, and the house that wins gets a trip to Accelerant. The children work very hard to make these banners special. After the parade is over, everyone meets in the JA Culbreth Memorial Auditorium for a special program that is performed by the children, faculty and staff of Falcon Children's Home.

10 Personal Questions to Help You Start the New Year Well

We are welcoming in a new year. 2024 is here! It contains 365 opportunities to do good, learn and grow, and live authentically with integrity. 2024 brings us 365 days to touch people's lives in the name of Jesus. I hope and pray that your life and ministry will be truly blessed and fruitful in 2024!

One of the best ways to maximize your life and ministry in this new year is to reflect on last year. Reflection is good for the soul. Can you get away for a quiet day or half day this week? Or perhaps simply go to your favorite coffee shop for a couple hours to think about last year to gain insights and inspiration for this year. If quiet reflection is not motivating for you, try it verbally with your spouse or a close friend. The key is to make it enjoyable, not a chore.

Regardless of your wiring, personality, or the amount of time you have for this, investing quality think time to process 2023 will position you for a substantially better 2024. Reflection is good for the soul, but is even better if you act on it. There are three keys to getting the most out of this process.

BE HONEST – Be honest with yourself. Ask a close and trusted friend to "test" your reflections. But, short of that, being authentic with yourself is essential. Don't beat yourself up, but tell yourself the truth.

EXPRESS GRATITUDE – The best disposition for this reflection is gratitude. If you begin by writing a quick list about all that you are thankful for specifically in 2023, the process will be more encouraging and productive.

TAKE ACTION – If you want 2024 to be all it can be, take action. Do something. That's the bottom line. Change and growth. How do you want to be different? Live differently? Lead better? You get to choose.

10 Personal Questions

Allow these questions to serve you as a guide for reflection and identify areas you would choose for growth.

1) Did you make a new friend?

Simple enough, right? Not always. Your life is busy, it's full, and it's difficult to find time to do all that you are currently responsible for. Where would you find time for a new friend? Yet one of the most valuable, enjoyable, growth-oriented, and life-giving things is found in meeting new people and making new friends. Are you where you want to be in this relational area?

2) Did you spend less than you made?

I hope that you did not endure a financial hardship this year that made this one impossible. If so, I pray this year is a fresh new start for you. Otherwise, we know the merit of this question and the wisdom of spending less than you make. The 10-10-80 method is still a great plan. Save 10 percent. Give 10 percent and Live on 80 percent. What changes are needed?

3) Did you pray in a way that your heart is full?

This might be a tough question. But to start, I don't mean it quantitatively. It's not about how much you prayed, (though that can matter), but the results of your prayers. Did you pray in a way that you saw God move? Did your prayers draw you closer to God's heart in 2023? Did you sense the power of the Holy Spirit at work? In what way would you like to see your prayer life become more powerful this year?

4) Did you take good care of your body or focus on your health?

Don't stop reading now. I know this one may feel extra personal, but it's just for you to consider. As someone who ate homemade chocolate chip cookies every night for some thirty years, I have my struggles here! But, it's possible to eat smart and exercise regularly. Don't pick a hard-core fad. Start simple. Celebrate your success, (not with a cookie). And keep going. If you are beginning, even a brisk walk 3-5 times a week can be life changing!

5) Did you learn something new and specific about leadership?

Naming what you learned last year and in what specific way you are a better leader is vitally important. It's possible to lead for an entire year, work hard, read books, listen to podcasts and not learn or practice something new as a leader. Set your sights high for 2024.

6) Did you love your family in a way they feel it?

It doesn't matter if you are a thinking or feeling based person, (Myers Briggs), or if you are an introvert or extrovert. Loving people in a way they receive it and feel it matters. The simple love language guide that Gary Chapman wrote years ago is still a great tool. The 5 are Words of affirmation, Acts of service, Receiving gifts, Quality time, and Physical touch. Do you know which one matches those you love the most?

7) Did you forgive someone who hurt you?

As a pastor, I'm very aware of the hurts that people carry. I hear the stories and understand how hard it can be to forgive. And leaders are by no means exempt from this kind of pain. Nonetheless, the burden from lack of forgiveness is greater than the burden to find the grace to forgive genuinely. You may not be able to forgive fully in an instant, but you can start the process by acknowledging intent and desire to forgive. Then, if your heart is genuine, God will help you get there.

8) Did you finish that one big project?

This is one of the questions that I don't have the response I would like. I had a writing project I wanted to complete last year, but I barely got it started. In addition to the writing goal, I'm focusing on a couple big new leadership development projects and finishing a couple projects at home from last year.

9) Did you focus on positive and forward-moving thoughts?

One of the most healthy and productive disciplines as a leader is staying focused on positive, pure and productive thoughts. It's not as easy as it may seem. From difficult times in general to the fact that the enemy wants to cloud our minds with negative, self-defeating and sinful thoughts, it takes disciplined focus to remain consistently positive.

10) Did you hear God speak clearly to you?

We touched on this in question #3, but where it focused on prayer, this one centers on a specific element of prayer – hearing the voice of God. What was the most impacting thing you heard God say to you in 2023? What is the last thing you heard God say to you in 2023? How did they change you? Listening is core to this practice, followed by joyful obedience.

I hope these practical and personal questions help you have a fantastic New Year!

In the past 14 years, you, the Appalachian Conference family, have helped fund 11 churches through World Missions (and church plants right here in our region)! These congregations around the world are part of our extended family. This year brings a fresh opportunity to help the Rose of Sharon Church in the Dominican Republic (DR).

The project vision is to partner with Pastor Roselio in the completion of a permanent structure at Rosa de Sharón the 4th.

Pastor Roselio is married to his wife, Yanet, and together they have served in ministry for 24 years. They served in local church leadership through evangelism within the IPHC for 20 years, and four years ago they heard the call of God to pastor a church. Having a heart for vulnerable communities, they moved from the heart of the

city to the outskirts to a new neighborhood called Tierra de Dios (Land of God). This is a "daily wage" small community, on the very northern edge of the city.

Six years ago when this community first began, there were only four families, but now it is a continually growing neighborhood. The community is one of Dominicans and Haitians "sharing everything together as one." The church is currently home to around 46 adults and 75 children.

When the church was planted, it was made to be an iron sheet temporary building. Recently, as God has blessed the church, they have been laying the walls, one concrete brick at a time, for their permanent building. Currently, they have built two of the four exterior walls of the church through God's provision. In addition, the local DR IPHC Conference has done mission outreaches in this community.

The church has a vision to continue building a second floor in the future to use as a school for the undocumented Haitian children in the community. There are families in the community who cannot read or write, and the church hopes to be a bridge in educating the next generation of children who may struggle to receive education.

This is a \$27,000 project. Can you help this church family have a permanent home? Direct your giving to #67500P Dominican Republic Ministry Projects.

A joint conference team sponsored by Discipleship Ministries and Missions & Evangelism will travel to the Dominican Republic on July 8-15 to help continue construction of the permanent building. Revival in India

God used Pastor Shantial to personally raise more than 70 powerful young church planters (men and women) within the last two years, and they have planted more than 220 churches.

Pastor Shantial is a humble servant of God and never demands anything. He is completely sold out for Jesus. He leaves his house every day at 9 AM and returns only after 8 PM. Every day he takes young people along with him and trains them. He goes to new villages where there is no church sharing the gospel. What we are seeing in his ministry is unprecedented. He is a man of prayer. Every morning he gets up at 4 AM and asks God for new souls. He lives in one of the most backward regions of Bihar state and this is a hilly region. Travelling on a motorcycle for hours on these so-called roads, full of rocks and potholes, have taken a heavy load on his health. He had a severe heart issue two years back and had to go through surgery. The doctor has advised him not to travel in such rough conditions but he told him that till his last breath he will continue to do what God has called him for. Shantial is benefitted by the teachings on the Great Commission and I am grateful to Pastor Van and Pastor Jim Eby for their teaching which is bringing fruit. Young men and women are being trained.

Baptisms are happening almost every day and churches are being planted every week. He is continuously raising leaders.

Philippians 3:13-14 (NIV): "Brothers and sisters, I do not consider myself yet to have taken hold of it. But one thing I do: Forgetting what is behind and straining toward what is ahead, I press on toward the goal to win the prize for which God has called me heavenward in Christ Jesus."

With social assaults on masculinity, sexual identity and religious freedoms, our young men and boys struggle with confidence in who they are and their Christian purpose more now than ever.

Reflecting on over 25 years in youth ministry, a decade of leadership within The Boy Scouts of America and several years in Men's Ministries, I understand my calling and passion are to simply share and pass on the faith and integrity of my upbringing. We lived only minutes from my grandfathers, who both raised large families in the traditional community of my beloved Appalachian

The Message by Rick Magee and Steve Winesett

Excitement filled the air in Hillsville, VA, as the boys began to be dropped off. It was early on the second Saturday of October in Southwest Virginia and the men leading the boys were already at the church anticipating bruised arms, broken arrows, mangled targets, and helping boys with aiming bows and arrows they are going to shoot. A local professional archer had shared several youth bows and 3D archery targets. Moms were all smiles as the overly excited adolescent gangly legs clamored out of the minivans and pickup trucks. Once everyone arrived, the men organized the boys and the equipment and headed to the shelter.

This is how a Kids Outdoor Zone (KOZ) Saturday morning starts. Men and boys seeking adventure and outdoor fun. Once they arrived at the event, our October event on archery, one of the men led everyone in a biblical devotion and conversation related to archery. If I asked, the KOZ kids could respond with the connection taught from Genesis 21:20 (NIV), "God was with the boy as he grew up. He lived in the desert and


became an archer." We let the boys know how much they are loved and cared for by the men standing with them and ultimately by God Himself. We've found that this is exactly what a boy needs; adventure, purpose, meaning and the ultimate playground...the outdoors.

If you aren't aware, we are in a crisis in our country today. Boys in our culture are struggling. What is their role? What does a noble man look like? What does honor look like? What message in our culture are they to believe? Did you know some statistics show that

boys average spending over 70 hours each week in front of electronics and less than 40 minutes each week outdoors? The average age of a licensed hunter or fisherman is over 55 years old! When we add these astonishing averages to the fatherless statistics, the crisis becomes staggering. Almost one-half of the boys growing up in America today will wake up in a fatherless home. Eighty-five percent of youth in juvenile detention facilities are from fatherless homes.

KOZ believes the answers to these overwhelming problems are found in two places: the church and the outdoors. KOZ trains and equips men in local churches to use the outdoors to create adventures (one Saturday morning each month) that speak to the boys' hearts. The different month's adventures include fishing, hunting, survival, hiking, swimming, shooting, archery and camping. In addition, the men use these Saturdays to mentor the boys in skill development, behavior training and have conversations by the creek or at the shooting range that turn into strategic moments of encouragement, counsel and yes – the gospel.

At the end of every KOZ morning we have the boys sit by themselves to contemplate and pray. Each boy takes a 5 x 7 index card and pencil with them and writes down their thoughts of the day and things they'd like for us to pray for. You can only imagine what's been written on these

their false bravado to show us who they really are...broken and hurting little boys with real questions that need godly men to answer.
