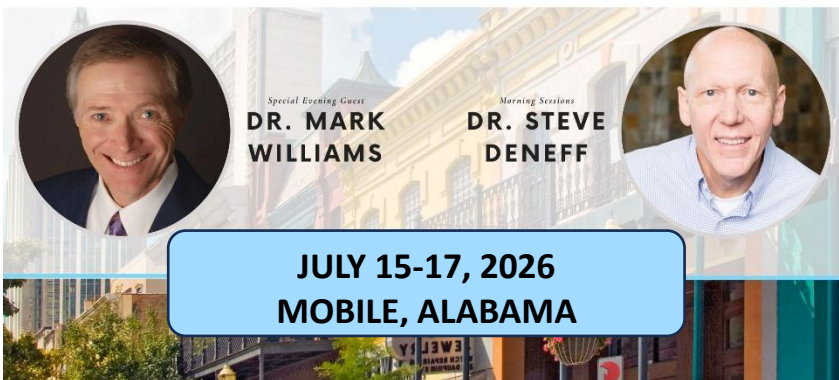

What is the problem? It honestly doesn't look like the foundation has given way. It looks like an inadequate sized board was used to carry the weight of the roof structure.



Picture your life as a building right now. Is it level and square? Or is the structure of your life straining under the weight of poor choices and neglect? You are the builder. Paul instructs us in 1 Cor. 3:10, *"to build with care."* The choice of materials is critical in building a life that will withstand the day where all is to be revealed.

## Welcome to 2026!

January 1st of each year marks the beginning of some form of newness for most of humanity. We desire something different in our lives, and what better time to start than the beginning of a new year? This is the season when we resolve to eat better, lose weight, exercise more, and stress less, to enhance our physical lives. A new year invites fresh starts and renewed focus.

As pastors and leaders, we also begin to cast vision for the New Year, believing God will enrich our spiritual lives and the spiritual lives of others. As God speaks to our hearts, we passionately share with others, trusting that their hearts will be moved by what has first moved ours. We have experienced the transforming power of the Gospel of Jesus Christ.

As I reflect on a statement Luke records Jesus making to Zacchaeus, my heart is filled with deep passion. Luke writes, *"For the Son of Man has come to seek and to save that which was lost."* When I consider this declaration, three words capture my attention, ignite a fire of passion, and deserve closer examination.

### The first word: **"Seek."**

Jesus confirms that one of His roles on earth is to seek. Imagine for a moment a group of children playing hide-and-seek on a warm summer evening. One child counts while the others search for the perfect hiding place. Suddenly, you hear the words, *"Ready or not, here I come!"* With excitement and anticipation, the seeker begins the search.

Jesus' seeking is filled with even greater purpose and passion. He does not wander aimlessly or casually glance around. He seeks intentionally, persistently, and lovingly. Jesus came actively looking for people, those pushed to the margins, overlooked, and forgotten. His seeking is deliberate and fueled by compassion.

### The second word: **"Save."**

Jesus confirms that another part of His mission on earth is to save. Saving implies rescue, delivering someone from danger, hopelessness, or destruction. Humanity was not merely misplaced; we were broken and separated from God. Jesus did not come simply to locate us but to redeem us.

Salvation is not an abstract idea or religious language; it is transformation. Jesus saves completely: restoring identity, healing wounds, and offering eternal life. His saving work continues today through the power of the gospel and the obedience of those who carry it to the world.

### The third word: **"Lost."**

Those Jesus came to seek and save were lost, not hidden, not forgotten, but disconnected from God. Lostness describes spiritual separation, regardless of social status, success, or appearance. Zacchaeus was wealthy and influential, yet still lost. Many today appear secure and fulfilled, yet remain spiritually disconnected.

This is where the heart of missions beats strongest. The lost might be found in our own homes, workplaces, marketplaces, and even within our churches. The lost could include family members, co-workers, and all whom we love. The lost are everywhere, across the street and across the globe. They are not projects to be completed but people deeply loved by God. Jesus' declaration reminds us that the mission is not finished. God invites us to partner with him to fulfill His mission.

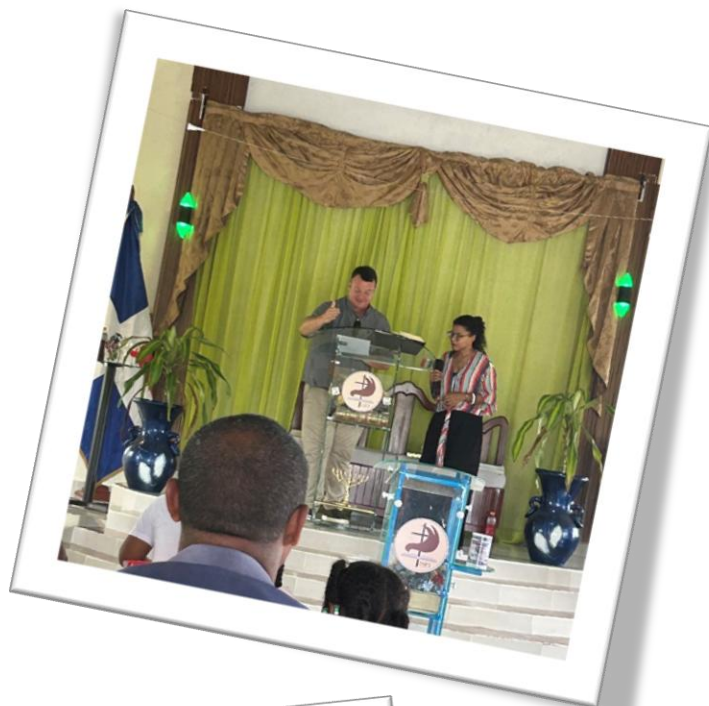
We must allow the Holy Spirit to reignite the passion for the lost, inspiring us to be invested through our prayer, service, and giving. We must pray for those who do not know Jesus at an intimate level, believing they will have a transformative relationship with Him.



We must serve through our speaking, our engagement with the community, and our everyday lives so that others can encounter Jesus. We must continue to give so others can take the gospel to the locations where we do not have the means to travel.

As we step into 2026, may we recommit ourselves to Christ's mission. Let us seek with purpose, serve with compassion, and proclaim salvation with boldness. Whether through prayer, giving, or going, we are all called to participate in God's redemptive work.

## **PRAISE! PEACE! AND POWER!**

Have you heard the commercial that highlights the THREE P's? It is a catchy phrase that grabs your attention. Then you discover that it is an insurance ad which states the THREE P's are PRICE, PRICE and PRICE!

The topic today is about THREE P's. However, these P's are proven spiritual responses that bring forth great victories! It all begins with PRAISE. Heaven responds to those who offer sincere PRAISES! The Lord inhabits the praises of His followers. This means that He dwells with them. He is present with them.

*"But thou art holy, O thou that inhabits the praises of Israel" (Psalm 22:3).*

Jesus confirmed the significance of PRAISE when He talked with the woman of Samaria at Jacob's well. Praise is a force that penetrates the spiritual realm, and it attracts the attention of the heavenly Father. Praise is so valued that the Father seeks those who worship in spirit and in truth.

*"But the hour comes, and now is, when true worshipers shall worship the Father in spirit and in truth: for the Father seeks such to worship Him" (John 4:23).*

### **HIGH PRAISES**

HIGH PRAISES OF GOD are viewed as a spiritual weapon in Psalm 149:6.

*"Let the high praises of God be in their mouth, and a two-edged sword in their hand;*

*To execute vengeance upon the heathen, and punishments upon the people;*

*To bind their kings with chains, and their nobles with fetters of iron;*

*To execute upon them the judgment written: this honor have all His saints.*

*Praise you the Lord" (Psalm 149:6-9).*

HIGH PRAISES OF GOD can be understood as those which establish the Kingdom of God by defeating the enemy.



The Lord's Prayer includes a prayer for God's Kingdom to come.

*"Thy Kingdom come, Thy will be done in earth, as it is in heaven" (Matthew 6:10).*

Our efforts should focus on bringing forth God's Kingdom into all realms of earth!

### **PRAISE THAT OPENS PRISON DOORS**

Paul and Silas brought God's Kingdom into an oppressive prison. They were beaten and bruised and cast into prison by evil men who falsely accused them. Paul and Silas had been teaching God's Word in the city of Thyatira. They were welcomed and supported by a leading woman of the city named Lydia. During their teaching sessions, they were rudely interrupted by a damsel possessed by a spirit of divination. (Acts 16:11-24)

The damsel followed them and shouted, *"These men are the servants of the Most High God, which show unto us the way of salvation" (Acts 16:17).*

She followed them for many days and Paul was distressed and grieved by her actions. (Acts 16: 17) One day Paul commanded the evil spirit to leave her. That very same hour she was delivered from the spirit of divination. Unfortunately, her masters were not pleased about her deliverance. She had brought them much money with her evil gifts. Now she was no longer able to bring profit. For this reason, these evil masters had charges brought against Paul and Silas.

But Paul and Silas demonstrated great faith in the prison. They praised God while their feet were bound in stocks. Their praises were loud and the other prisoners heard them. (Acts 16:25) Heaven also heard their praises and saw their faith.

Suddenly a great earthquake erupted and shook the prison doors open! When the keeper of the prison saw that the doors were opened and the prisoners could escape, he took a sword and started to thrust it into his body, because he knew the Romans would kill him. However, Paul stopped him and told him that everyone was there. Nobody tried to escape. This news brought the jailer to his knees, and he asked Paul what he should do to be saved. (Acts 16:26-34)

### **PEACE AND POWER**

The praises of Paul and Silas brought peace into a troubled place. Likewise, our praises can bring peace into places of conflict and tension. Our praises can bring light into areas of darkness. And our praises can bring POWER from heaven into the situation!
