September - The Day the World Came to Town (Non-Fiction)

The story of 38 jetliners rerouted to Gander, Newfoundland on September 11, 2001. About 6,000 passengers from around the world are greeted with an outpouring of friendship and goodwill rarely seen.

October - The Kite Runner

An epic tale of fathers and sons, of friendship and betrayal, that takes us from Afghanistan in the final days of the monarchy to the atrocities of the present.
