Your sponsored child lives in the Santiago de Lacaya zone of the city of La Paz, home to approximately 3,700 residents. Most of the residents are young couples with multiple children, migrants from rural areas. The primary ethnic group is Aymara, and the most commonly spoken language is Spanish. Typical houses are constructed of dirt floors, cement walls and metal roofs.

The regional diet consists of bananas, beef, bread, chicken and fish. Many adults in Santiago de Lacaya are unemployed; the main occupations are day labor for masons or bricklayers and trading in the market. The average family income is equivalent to \$260 per month. This community needs a health center and public lighting.

Your sponsorship allows the staff of El Aposento Alto Center for Integral Development to provide your sponsored child with Bible teaching, food, health screening, hygiene and basic life-skills training, school supplies, a safe place for indoor and outdoor games, soccer tournaments, vocational training and opportunities for community service. The center staff will also provide family visits and evangelistic activities for the parents or guardians of your sponsored child.

Your sponsored child lives in the forested community of Dormaa Akwamu, home to approximately 10,000 residents. Typical houses are constructed of cement floors, brick walls and tin roofs. The primary ethnic group and commonly spoken language is Bono.

The regional diet consists of bananas, beans, beef, bread, cassava, chicken, eggs and rice. A common health problem in this area is malaria. Most adults in Dormaa Akwamu work as market traders or subsistence farmers and earn the equivalent of \$50 per month. This community needs permanent employment opportunities, additional health centers and scholastic materials.

Your sponsorship allows the staff of Dormaa Akwamu Methodist Child Development Centre to provide your sponsored child with Bible teaching, health screenings, hygiene training, nutrition lessons, special celebrations, retreats, drama and music classes, games, contests, educational assistance, life skills training and career guidance. The center staff will also provide health education and hygiene training for the parents or guardians of your sponsored child.
