
November 30th Isaiah's Plea




Isaiah was a prophet in the Old Testament. This meant Isaiah got special messages from God that he shared with God's people.





God's people were sinning; they were disobeying God's commands. This made Isaiah upset. Sin hurts God and people. He cried out to God asking Him to make Himself known to the people on Earth.



God is powerful! Isaiah talked about how mountains quake and tremble in God's presence. Isaiah also tells of how God is unlike other gods- God loves His people and doesn't abandon them. But sin makes God angry.



Even though the people sinned, Isaiah also reminded them that God is powerful and their loving Father in Heaven. Isaiah tells the people that God is like a potter, and we are like the clay. The potter shapes us and makes us. We are God's creation!



Isaiah gave hope to the people by telling them a son was going to be born and would save them. He said the son will be called: "Wonderful counselor, Mighty God, Everlasting Father, Prince of Peace." This son was Jesus!



Isaiah begged God to open the heavens and come down to save the people, and that's just what He did when Jesus came down from heaven to us on Christmas!

December 14th


Angels' and Shepherds' Praise

Our Praise – Jesus is born!






While they were there, the time came for Mary to have her baby. Mary and Joseph looked for a safe place to stay. All the houses were full. There was no place to stay.
