Lenten Sermon Series

Healing of Body, Mind, Soul, and Broken Relationships: A Journey to and Through Lent

All of us have experienced a very bad day, days, weeks, and even years. Our bodies hurt; we want healing. We can't do the things we were used to doing or want to do. Our mind swirls with anxiousness as we endure restless nights. We realize we aren't able to process as we would want and tend to take parts of what we hear out of context. We fixate on one or two things that bother us about someone or a situation, and then are unable to see the good in that person or situation. Our soul is weary. We don't have the words to pray. We feel alone and far from God. Life seems like a wilderness. We find ourselves in a desert season. Life gets overwhelming as the losses and years of broken relationships continue to pile up.

Through February and March, we will focus on the healing of our body, mind, soul, and broken relationships. On March 10, as part of our Worship Service, we will offer a Service of Healing. We will ask God to heal us - however God chooses – body, mind, soul, and/or broken relationships, so we can step into the resurrection promise of Easter, refreshed, and renewed.

Kyle Houts will offer the message on March 3 and 17.

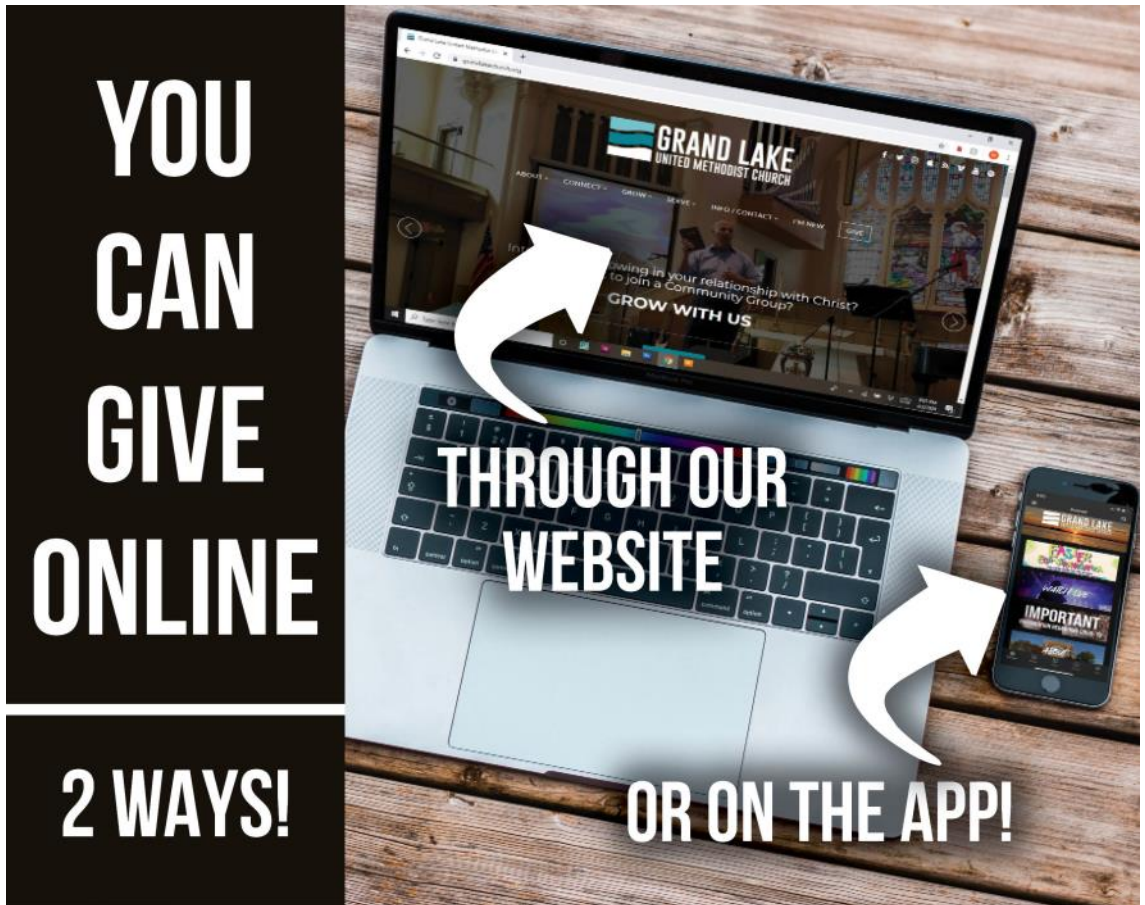

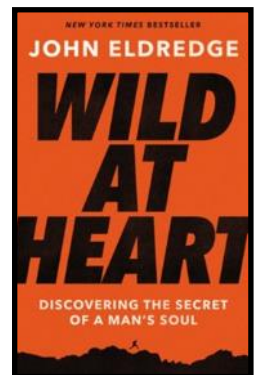

Scholarships

The Scholarship Committee annually makes available three different scholarships. These scholarships are for students enrolled in a two year or more accredited institution of higher learning.

The three types of scholarships available at Grand Lake UMC are:

1. Grand Lake UMC Scholarship

Available to any member or regular attendee of Grand Lake UMC.

2. Grand Lake Service Scholarship

Available to any member or regular attendee of Grand Lake UMC. The award is made for unpaid service provided for Grand Lake UMC. Specific service is to be proposed through the application process and completed during the academic year. The scholarship is to be paid upon completion of the service.

3. Grand Lake UMC Student in Ministry

Available to any member or regular attendee of Grand Lake UMC. Applicant must be enrolled as an undergraduate or graduate student at an accredited institution full time in

preparation for the ministry, Christian education, or a church related vocation. These grants will be given as a loan to the students and are forgiven upon verification of required years of ministry. Students who leave school or the ministry are expected to repay unforgiven portions of the award.

*Application forms are available in the church office. **They must be completed and returned by MARCH 31, 2024.***

These scholarships and the amounts granted are subject to the approval of the Church's Administrative Council. Distribution of checks will be prior to the Fall semester/quarter.

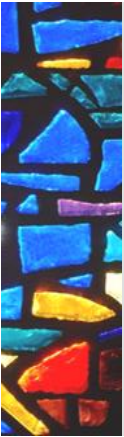
RightNow Media

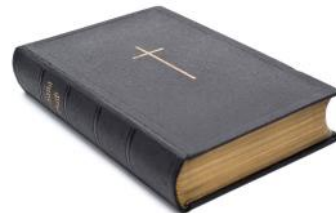
EMMAUS WALK

What is a Community Group?

G – Guided by a Leader:

Every community group needs a leader. The leader is a capable, qualified Grand Lake member/regular attendee who assumes spiritual responsibility for this community group of people. He/She/they agree to love and invest in these people and strive to lead them to grow closer to God and to be in relationship with one another.

R – Regular meeting times, preferably weekly:

The goal is to meet frequently enough for friendships to form and to be able to recognize when someone is not connected or struggling.

O – Open God's Word:

When groups meet, time is set aside to explore and discuss God's Word together. The Bible is always the central driving force behind everything we do. The focus in a community group is to talk about God's Word together in a way that helps us to be more obedient so that we will be "doers" of the Word and not "hearers" only. (James 1:22)

U – United in Love:

The goal is to not only grow closer to God but also to each other in order to reach COMMUNITY – authentically being a part of each other's lives – throughout the week and not just during the meetings. A healthy community group is bound by a "Community Group Covenant."

P – Pray for one another:

Time will always be set aside where we can genuinely share what's going on in our lives and authentically pray for one another.
