# PASTORS Page

I'm writing this article at the end of my first week back from renewal leave. It's been a crazy week of catching up and returning to a productive routine. I've been racking my brain, struggling, and even worrying a bit about what to write, knowing that the deadline for submission was fast approaching. The peace, rest, and joy of renewal leave were already starting to feel like little more than a distant memory as the pressures and reality of everyday life returned.

Thankfully, once again, God showed up at just the right time. Through my devotional reading and Scripture reading this morning, God gently reminded me of what he had been teaching me throughout my renewal leave. Jesus Calling for this day speaks about resisting the "activity addiction of this age." One of the support Scriptures was Isaiah 30:15, "This is what the Sovereign Lord, the Holy One of Israel, says: 'In repentance and rest is your salvation, in quietness and trust is your strength, but you would have none of it.'" That verse hit me hard because I do struggle with activity addiction. I think it goes back to my first corporate marketing job when the V.P. would walk around the office around 6:00 pm to see who was still working. You had to sacrifice family, fun, and rest to succeed in that corporate culture. I didn't realize until recently how much that experience shaped the rest of my working life, in some rather unhealthy ways. Then, my Scripture reading for the day was in Hebrews. Chapter 3 describes the hardened and rebellious hearts of the Israelites during the Exodus. God said, "Their hearts are always going astray" (v. 10) and "They shall never enter my rest" (v. 11).

God was revealing something to me, but it wasn't quite clear yet. As I was walking back to my office from the restroom, I saw something that pulled it all together for me. A bulletin board that says "Jesus Is Our True North" and "Learning to Follow Jesus." The theme of this bulletin board is hiking. That hit me like a ton of bricks because I spent considerable time on my renewal leave in nature, including hiking at Hocking Hills. I had never been there before and was in awe of the natural beauty of God's good creation, especially that close to home. I prayed a lot as I hiked and drank in all of this natural beauty. My prayers seemed to focus on two main themes: (1) rekindling the spiritual fire within me that I had when I first entered vocational ministry, and (2) being able to rest in God's presence. It seemed that, with the Holy Spirit's help, I was beginning to realize my long-time struggle with "activity addiction," and the way that can, to some degree, harden one's heart.

Of course, we are all called to be active in our jobs, churches, and communities. But not at the expense of spending quality time with God and resting in his presence. That's why the Sabbath is one of the 10 Commandments, so we never forget to rest in God's presence. To be still and know that He is God. To remember that "In repentance and rest is your salvation, in quietness and trust is your strength." I have to be reminded of this a lot. You probably do too. And I've discovered that when I embrace this truth, that's when life becomes truly abundant. I pray that the Holy Spirit continually reminds all of us to embrace this truth, remember that Jesus is our true north, and (re)learn to follow him, so we can all live truly abundant lives.

# ALL SAINTS Sunday

On Sunday, November 2, we will gather for worship to celebrate All Saints Sunday. This is a time to remember and give thanks for those in our church family who have entered the church triumphant. During the service, we will read the Roll of the Victorious and light a candle in honor of each life, reminding us that the light of Christ continues to shine through their witness. Please join us for this special day of remembrance, gratitude, and hope as we honor the saints who have gone before us.

The celebration of All Saints' Day dates back to the early centuries of the Church, when Christians began honoring the martyrs who gave their lives for the faith. In the beginning, each martyr was remembered on a particular day, but as the number of witnesses to the faith grew—especially during the Roman persecutions—it became impossible to commemorate them all individually. Out of this challenge came the beautiful practice of setting aside one day to honor all the saints, both known and unknown.

John Wesley, the founder of Methodism, held a deep devotion to the idea of the communion of saints. For him, All Saints' Day was not only about remembering the great figures of church history but also about cherishing the spiritual bond that unites all Christians—past, present, and future. He encouraged Methodists to keep the day as a time of reflection and gratitude for God's grace made visible in countless lives.

For us, All Saints' Sunday is a tender time of remembrance and hope. We remember with gratitude the people who have gone before us in faith—especially loved ones we have lost in the past year—and we hold onto the hope of Christ's promise of eternal life. It is a day to give thanks for lives that have touched ours, and to rejoice in the truth that we are never alone: we are part of a great family of faith, joined together in God's love.
