THE CAUSE

PURPOSE STATEMENT

The body of believers that assemble at the Kingdom Baptist International Church do so to give glory to God. When meeting, we attempt to learn and grow in the culture of the Kingdom that we may share in a capacity that will enhance the spiritual life of the believer and build their purpose on earth. Through singing, praise, worship, preaching and teaching, exhorting, and sharing, we extend the family and body of Christ from the people locally and throughout the world. We purpose to love people for who they are and not what they have; accept their differences, and not ostracize them; lock arms with them, be their support, and not walk away in their time of need; above all, we desire to "do good to all people, especially those who are of the household of faith. CHURCH VALUES

The church of Jesus Christ is an organism that lives by impeccable standards set forth by the Word of God holding us accountable as Christians. It is the desire of this church to abide by the standards of the Word of God and adhere to them in the spirit of excellence by which we are called. The standards by no means replace any other portion of scripture, however, we endeavor to epitomize those things that Jesus put a priority on.

Fellowship is one of the primary functions of the believer. Hebrews 10:25 (NKJV) says, "...not forsaking the assembling of yourselves together, as in the manner of some, and so much the more as you see the day approaching." I believe with all my heart that we grow as a ministry when we share good things with others. But we grow as a family when we show up and support one another. The purpose of any gathering at our church is to educate, empower, encourage, and equip. No church I can think of desires the rivers of fellowship to flow like KBI. Fellowship is such a paramount order that as with your other priorities, it should be scheduled and attended. Without you, there can never be an us.

Discipleship is another item in our value system that makes our church complete. In *II Timothy* 2:15 (NKJV), it says, "Study to show yourselves approved unto God, a workman that needs no to be ashamed, rightly dividing the Word of truth." The best life is a word-centered life. When we make it a priority to study the Word of God, we find the roadmap to the possibilities that God has given us. It is an exciting journey once you have the directions to destiny! Finding new things in the Word of God is exhilarating! Putting them into action is simply rewarding. Our church is a Bible based, Bible believing and Bible preaching ministry.

Stewardship is key to the growth of any Christian. We at KBI put a priority on the training and practicing of stewardship. Stewardship means more than money; it most nearly means the management of all assets of an owner including your life. In Psalm 24:1, we discover that, "The earth is the Lord's and the fullness thereof, the world and they that dwell therein." We believe that everything that we have belongs to God and that we are simply managing it. Malachi 3:10 tells us, "Bring ye all the tithes into the storehouse that there may be meat in Mine house and prove me now this says the Lord of Hosts, if I will not open up the windows of heaven and pour you out a blessing that there shall not be room enough to receive it." And in the book of Luke 6:38 it says, "Give and it shall be given unto you, good measure, pressed down, shaken together, and running over shall men give unto your bosom."

The truth of the matter is that even though we are in control of what God owns, there is a natural human tendency to hoard, finagle and keep. This goes against the teachings of Jesus and the Bible. We tithe, give offerings, sacrificial gifts, and what we call seeds. A "tithe", is a tenth, or ten percent of your gross income to God through His storehouse or commonly known today as the church. That is His requirement! An "offering" is anything above your tithe. God seeks offerings to deter people from doing the minimum out of obligation, not sincerity. A "sacrificial gift" or "sacrificial offering" is an offering that you give in appreciation and love for God that is done out of total submission, loyalty, and revelation. Then finally, Jesus speaks of the farmer who sows "seeds" that are planted from a genuine heart in glorified soil for a great harvest.

Evangelism is the motor that keeps ministry fresh and growing. In **Matthew 28:19-20 (NKJV)**, we discover Jesus' message on evangelism in these words, "Go ye therefore and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father, Son and the Holy Spirit, (v. 20) teaching them to observe all things that I have commanded you, and Io, I am with you always, even to the end of the age." Amen. The Christian manifesto is neatly discussed in this message from the enunciator of evangelism Himself. Our duty is to witness, share, and discuss our faith and experiences with others to encourage them to seek our Christ and become a citizen of His kingdom. Not merely from the theological point, but from the experiential as well. Christ is the center of all joy for us, and we express Him not only as the Christ of the Bible, but as the happiness, help, and hope of our lives.

The main part of evangelism is the "going" part. It is not evangelism if it is in the comfortable confines of our church. We are called to share and then share not only from the Bible but also from the heart. Apostle Peter said in I Peter 3:15b, "...always be ready to give a defense to everyone who asks you a reason for the hope that is in you with meekness and fear...". Thusly, our challenge is to give people a reason why we have hope in Jesus. We live in a world that is very weak and very wicked. Many people are hurting right in our own families and need to know the healing, salvation, and message of Jesus Christ. We are the light, we are the salt, and we are the city set on a hill. If we will just shine, season, and stay, others will see our good works and worship Christ.

Creativity is the mother of a skillful, successful, and strong ministry. In Ephesians 3:30 (NKJV), we get the privilege to peek into a new power source that makes ministry happen. It reads, "Now to Him Who is able to do exceedingly, abundantly, above all that we ask or think, according to the power that works in us." God has released the talent, giftedness, innate ability, and skills within us to do all that we have been challenged by Him to do in the vision. We have access that we never had before, we have leadership that is more daring and faith conscious than ever before, and we have tenacious people willing to submit and follow more than ever before. What then is lacking? It is the creative edge to do the unthinkable.

I don't believe God intended for us to be a "feeder church", or better said, a church that is always looking up to others. I believe that even as we have mentors in our personal lives, so will our church. But there comes a time when the mentor and protégée become peers. That is the vision of our congregation. We are a gathering of people that stand together, to pool our knowledge, resources, experience, wisdom, abilities, and strengths to build a bigger, brighter, better Kingdom Baptist International Church. The exciting part for me is that this scripture tells me of God's ability to do it and the impetus for Him doing it is already locked up within us!

Leadership is the tool that takes the big picture and makes it digestible and realistic. John Maxwell says, "Everything rises and falls on leadership." I agree! Apostle Paul says in *II* **Thessalonians 3:9b, "...but to make ourselves an example of how you should follow us."**Leadership is a principal ingredient to the success of anything. Our church is dedicated to godly leadership that leads from the front and not from the rear. You will see that the leadership of our church will be a harmonious team of Christians dedicated to managing ministries, motivating people, and making an impact on the lives of the disciples. We are dedicated to the position that training and continuous education are essential from the pastor to all staff. It will be our endeavor to keep up with the latest information as well as be creative, developing ministry tools that will aid in the pursuit of the vision of the house. We will as well, always be seeking leaders to help keep the ministry fresh and thriving.

Commitment is the adhesive that holds the ministry together. Success has a greater possibility of manifestation when commitment is present. Jesus said in *Revelations 2:10c(NKJV), "...be faithful until death..."*. What a powerful message coming to us from Christ. The job of a church disciple has vastly changed over the years. We live in a time that people are called on to be more than pew holders and fan wavers. We have a job to do! All too often churches lose their vitality and fervor because Christians are committed only for a short time. Unfortunately, they tend to be the most committed when things are going well and less committed when they are not going well. For commitment to have a true interpretation, there must be consistency as well. If commitment is the chassis, then consistency is the body; they go together. More than ever before, the church needs committed individuals that are in a tri-fold arrangement. The tri-fold arrangement is: 1) committed and submitted to God; 2) committed and submitted to leadership; 3) committed and submitted to the church body. This is an all-weather commitment! We are committed to each other in good times, bad times, and anytime. Our maxim is—our church, our community, and our responsibility.

Organization is the impetus that helps our ministry operate smoothly. The summation of any undertaking should be equal to the organization to which it is/was managed. Super organization, super results. Poor organization, poor results. Apostle Paul says this to us in *I* **Corinthians 14:40, "Let all things be done in decently and in order."** There is a premium that we need to put on organization to do ministry. Ministry is meeting the needs of the people. Throughout the Old and New Testaments, there were calls and challenges for men and women to be organized so that effective ministry could be carried out. This is a call and challenge for the leadership and laity alike to be organized and intentional. God desires the best from us. We are to display God in every facet of our ministry. We bring no glory to God when we are not operating smoothly and intentionally. God will not dwell in the midst of confusion. So then, it is safe to say that God does not abide in an unorganized house. Through the aid of technology, creativity, leadership, and vision, we will have an organized ministry that will bring glory to God and help the people.

Service is our work for God to enhance the ministry of our local congregation and the Kingdom of God at large. In Nehemiah 4:6 we learn, "So we built the wall...for the people had a mind to work." The ministry needs hands that are willing to put their skills and abilities to use for the betterment of the ministry. This is often overlooked and forgotten. Everybody thinks that someone else can or will do it. The truth is that everybody has a duty and an obligation to work in the ministry. Apostle Paul tells us in Romans 12:4-5, "For as we have many members in one body, and all members have not the same office, so we being many are one in the body of Christ, and every one member one of another." The truth of the matter is this, we need every willing person to work with their hands, hearts, and abilities to maintain and improve the church and ministry.

When we the diversified body of Christ bring our talents together we are now operating as a well-oiled machine focused, deliberate, and intentional to do whatever it takes for the body of Christ. The plan of action to do this is five-fold: 1) each person shares their giftedness to help make the church better; 2) be willing to learn and use the acquired skills to promote excellence amongst the disciples; 3) encouraging others to freely donate their services and the services of their company, business, or trade for the benefit of the ministry; 4) look for areas of opportunity or improvement to intend to fix it, organize to fix it, and do it in an expeditious way; 5) help create an environment that recruits and empowers disciples to do their best, and excel in everything producing excellence.

Worship is the channel by which we culminate all of our values together. We have all of the other values, and they are preparatory values, in that they help us get ready to do this one value called worship. Worship is an essential part of our gathering each week, and one that ought to be taken very seriously. In John 4:23-24 we note, "But the hour has come and now is, when the true worshippers shall worship the Father in spirit and truth; for such people the Father seeks to be His worshippers. (v.24) God is a spirit, and those who worship Him must worship Him in spirit and truth." (NASB) So then one of the focal points of our gathering is to worship God. At KBI, we have exercised freedom and liberation that is ramped in our worship.

We sing, lift our hands, dance before the Lord, celebrate, rejoice, cry, run, meditate, pray, praise, clap our hands, shout with loud voices, and the like as we worship our great God. **Psalm 34** tells us to "Bless the Lord at all times; His praise shall continually be in my mouth." I am thankful; therefore, I worship. We, by no means, suggest that this is the only way to worship. Worship can be just as multifaceted and diverse, as it can be simple and serene. We do believe, however, that real worship will escape the bounds of one's true soul and fill the atmosphere with others seeking to do the same thing. When we do this, we extend and expand God! **Philippians 3:3** says, "For we are the circumcision, which worship God in the spirit...". We are the praying, praising church! We are happy and excited about Christ and the power we have with God through the essence and presence of the Holy Spirit!

ASSURANCE OF SALVATION

The first verses that you will memorize and study in orientation are the assurance of salvation. How can you defeat the devil? The answer is God's Word, the Bible. The Bible says you can know for sure that you have eternal life. Remember, assurance of salvation comes from faith in what God has said in His Word, not from feelings. Feelings will come and go and therefore are not reliable. God's Word is reliable!

GROWING AS A MEMBER

As a member we want you to grow with the congregation. Life is better when we serve together and connect with others. Part of our growth as a church is to get to know you better. As a member, you can serve in one of our ministries. We want you to know us as we get to know you with the love of Christ. Your growth is a very "big deal" to us as we desire to see the manifestation of what God has for you. God himself practices and models for us a form of membership. And God continues to establish the practice of congregational membership until the church is instituted to come by Christ.

Being a member of a local church does not get you into heaven automictically. According to scripture, some people will go to church all their life and still won't make it into the kingdom (Matthew 7:21). But in Matthew 16:18 Keys to the kingdom are given by Jesus to the church, giving the early church the power to externally affirm or deny the orthodoxy of the gospel proclaimed as a congregation and the genuineness of the Kingdoms language.

Your membership signifies your commitment to believe and live in a biblical, Godhonoring way. Standing in agreement as a member signifies that others can count on you to live according to the commitments specified in a church covenant—living a holistic life, attending our services, praying for your fellow church members, serving them, loving them, supporting the church's discipline and attending its ordinances (baptism and the Lord's Supper), growing in truth and love, evangelizing your unsaved friends, giving financially to support the ministry and needs of the church, etc.

As members we together choose to grow bearing one another's burdens, spurring one another on to love and with good deeds, and consider each other more important than yourselves. It is the people who sit next to you, rows behind you, three rows up, or across from you—the local people—that are the most likely beneficiaries of your love. Local church membership says, I love my church, and with them shall I build the Kingdom from the community to the country.

GROWING AS A CHRISTIAN

There are two things that God would like from every human being: The first is that they would become a Christian, and the second is that they will grow as Christians. Becoming a Christian is a one-time occurrence, but growing as a Christian is a continuous process. Since you are already a Christian, God now wants you to grow in Him.

Just as physical life requires food, rest, and exercise, so does spiritual life require certain things for growth and development. This lesson deals with five principles of growth. If they are followed, you can know that you will grow toward spiritual maturity in Christ.

A church is known not only by its history but also by its doctrine. The doctrine of Jesus' churches seeks to follow the pattern of Christ's Church in the New Testament. The Church thus believes that its history began with Christ, His followers, and the Holy Bible.

In this lesson, we will give you a brief outline of the ordinances of the Lord's church: Baptism and the Lord's Supper and officers: Pastor and deacons of Kingdom Baptist International Church. This lesson will show how Kingdom may, be different than to your previous church.

I. ORDINANCES

A Dantiam

Although Baptism is an ordinance of the Baptist Church, it is not a prerequisite for Salvation. It is an acceptance of Kingdom citizenship and a symbol of Christ's death, burial, and resurrection. It is an outward sign of inward grace.

Baptism: washing with water, which symbolizes the acceptance of doctrine, cleansing of believers from the stain and dirt of sin through the grace of God. Baptism is your official cleansing your walk with Jesus is the work required to stay cleansed. Jesus Christ had no sins that needed to be washed but He submitted to baptism as an example to believers but more importantly, to fall under the doctrine of John the Baptist who was preaching the Gospel of the kingdom of God. Through the work of the Holy Spirit, baptism is linked in union with the risen Jesus Christ. In the Gospels, baptizing is based on the symbolic practice in the Old Testament and Judaism of cleansing with water.

II. OFFICERS

Kingdom is a self-governing body whose members have equal rights, privileges and duties. The PASTOR is the chief officer, who is called by God to preach the gospel, and called by the church to serve as its leader. The office of DEACON is traced back to the first church in Jerusalem (Acts 6:3-7).

In accordance with the definition of the New Testament, deacons are to be servants of the church and assisters to the Pastor. Their responsibilities include caring for the discipleship, visiting and ministering to the sick, widows and orphans, and sharing /spreading the Gospel.

STEWARDSHIP & GIVING



This area falls under stewardship. It is each disciple's responsibility to not only tithe (1/10th of your gross income) giving back to God that which he has given you, but to sow seed offerings and sow into the life of the man and woman whom God has placed over you. In being good stewards of your finances with tithes and offerings, KBI provides you with an accurate financial statement at year-end and/or upon request. In doing this, these are the requirements:

- 1. Correctly complete your envelope (see example above) by using your full name or labels provided to you, filling out appropriate spaces provided for proper credit of all contributions made. If contributions are made by check please indicate the check number in the space provided on the envelope.
- 2. If you have attended this church prior to becoming a disciple, please contact the Director of Finance to verify any names that you may have used previously (e.g. Mr. & Mrs. J. Doe & Family, The Doe Family, or John & Jane Doe). This could be the same person but three different families have been created and credited based on the information provided.
- 3. When making cash contributions, always complete and seal your envelope before placing it in the offering receptacle. This is for your protection. When finances are counted and reconciled for the day, the Finance Ministry reconciles the amount written on the outside of the envelope with what is placed on the inside or by check numbers and amounts posted. Envelopes without proper identification and loose cash placed in the offering receptacle cannot be properly identified or credited to their giver. The Finance ministry totals the "None Identifiable" cash envelopes and the loose cash together as one unit (envelope) and gives it the identity of (NO NAME) for recording purposes.
- 4. When making a credit card contribution with a non-credit card enclosed, please provide the following information on your envelope example:

CC# (1234-5678-9012-345), Address # (1234), Zip (30064) and the Expiration Date (07/13).

Financial Statements:

All disciples will be given a copy of their financial statements at the beginning of each New Year or upon request.

DISCIPLESHIP ORIENTATION COMPLETION PROCESS

Below is the process to receive the Lord's Supper, the right hand of fellowship, and new disciples' completion certificates. This occurs every first Sunday that a new disciple has successfully completed his coursework.

After completion of all training courses and workshop requirements, you become eligible for the serving of communion by the officiating director of this service. After the directing officials serve you communion you will be presented with your certificate immediately after the completion of communion. Following the certificates of completion, you will be extended the right hand of fellowship.

Congratulations, you are a new disciple with all the rights of other disciples. You are expected to immediately become active in the ministries necessary to support the vision of the church. Here is something to keep in mind as you mature in your new church home. We are a church of practical Christianity that will educate, equip, and empower you to be successful spiritually and naturally. We look for you to hit your goal of being a great disciple of:

- The Kingdom
- Your time (a good manager/steward)
- Talents and treasures organized in your church, home, and place of employment
- Creative in your quest to take this church and your ministry to new levels.

HOW TO DISCOVER YOUR GIFTS

God is a God of variety, in the world and in his church. Each Christian has been given several gifts of the Spirit, which are meant to build up other believers in the Body of Christ. As each believer employs his gifts, the church is edified. Although you may believe that you have been given one or more gifts, knowing what it is – and using it – may be harder. How to go about discovering your spiritual capacities:

*List the gifts. Become informed about the many gifts to recognize your own. You likely have more than one gift. Do not overrate the nature of the gifts by thinking of them as something impressive when they may be quite ordinary. Instead of flamboyant, grandstand abilities, they may be silent, steady workings of the Holy Spirit. * Go to work. The Holy Spirit grants gifts to every child of God. The extent to which the divine design is fulfilled depends on your faithfulness. Therefore, you should go to work immediately. Expose yourself to various kinds of Christian service, perhaps first in the area of natural abilities. Don't give up if you have some early failures. Be willing to try something new that you previously thought you couldn't do.

* Note your inclination. If you are drawn toward a certain area of service, your desire may point to the existence of that gift. To a degree, gifts shape your future. With God, your desire, gift, and callings are related. A gift usually will be preceded by desire and followed by the opportunity to use it. Caution: the desire for a gift does not guarantee it. The final assignment belongs to God.

Commit. If you have progressed to this point, it may be time to dedicate yourself and these potential gifts to the Lord. Consciously place your gifts in the Lord's service, expressing your willingness to obey Him with spiritual capacities.

Develop your gifts. The existence of a gift is a call to exercise it. Gifts have been likened to seeds, which start small and bloom with proper care. Cultivation of a gift may mean formal training or being mentored by another person accomplished in the gift.

Delight. When you find your gift(s), there will be joy. This is what I'd rather be doing for the Lord than anything else in the world. This is my thing. This turns me on. Your joy is subconsciously communicated to the recipient of your ministry.

Let others discern. Because delight has subjective elements, submit you "eureka" feeling to the scrutiny of loving and discerning brethren. The confirmation that you do posses a gift is recognition of this gift by others.

Gifts if the Spirit includes: Speaking gifts: Apostolic gifts, prophecy, evangelism, shepherding, teaching, exhortation, knowledge and wisdom. Serving gifts: helps, hospitality, giving, government, showing mercy, faith and discernment. Signifying gifts: miracles, healing, tongues, and interpretation. There will always be debate on the actual number of gifts and the operation of gifts. There are several lists in the Bible, and each differ somewhat. Apostolic gifts are under the submission of the Pastor.

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
