

They found the stone rolled away from the tomb, but when they went in, they did not find the body. While they were perplexed about this, suddenly two men in dazzling clothes stood beside them. The women were terrified and bowed their faces to the ground, but the men said to them, "Why do you look for the living among the dead? He is not here, but has risen. Luke 24:2-5

Matthew, Mark and Luke are very similar and contain a lot of the same material. These three Gospels are called the "synoptic gospels," synoptic simply meaning "to see alike." Luke wasn't an original disciple/apostle of Jesus. He was a doctor or physician. We find out in the first few verses that he investigated everything very carefully. After doing so, he wrote an "orderly and the longest account" about the life of Jesus. Luke emphasizes Jesus' ministry to and care for the oppressed, poor, sick, and marginalized. In Luke's narrative, it seems like Jesus is either going to a meal, at a meal, or coming from a meal, but Jesus is never too hungry to be interrupted by anyone in need. This is where the theme of humility takes center stage. How many times could Jesus have said, "I'm on my way to something way too important"? This new sermon series will highlight the teachings and stories that are found only in Luke's Gospel?

Two of the most recognizable parables are The Good Samaritan (Luke 10:25-37) and The Prodigal Son (Luke 15:11-32). Both teach grace and unconditional love for all and not just the people approved by religious leaders. Zaccheus, the chief tax collector demonstrated his gratitude for that kind of abundant grace by allowing Jesus to invite Himself over for dinner (Luke 19:1-10). In addition to unique parables, Luke uses emphasizes the inner circle of amazing women who contributed to Jesus' ministry. Mother Mary is pretty obvious but there is also Mary Magdalene, Joana and Susanna all being mentioned with the twelve at the beginning of Luke 8. It was this group of women who passed on the message of the resurrection to the apostles in Luke 24.



March 29 / 7:00-8:00pm




