1. Encountering God and seeing Him clearly

Vs. 1-4

In the year of King Uzziah's death, I saw the Lord sitting on a throne, lofty and exalted, with the train of His robe filling the temple. Seraphim stood above Him, each having six wings; with two he covered his face, and with two he covered his feet, and with two he flew. And one called out to another and said, "Holy, Holy, Holy is the Lord of hosts, the whole earth is full of His glory." And the foundations of the thresholds trembled at the voice of him who called out, while the temple was filling with smoke.

2. Responding to God's Character and Nature with honest self-confrontation-- V. 5

Then I said, "Woe is me, for I am ruined! Because I am a man of unclean lips and I live among a people of unclean lips; For my eyes have seen the King, the Lord of hosts."

3. Experiencing God's grace leading to His cleansing and transformation -- Vs. 6-7

Then one of the seraphim flew to me, with a burning coal in his hand which he had taken from the alter with tongs. And he touched my mouth with it and said, "Behold, this has touched your lips; and your iniquity is taken away, and your sin is forgiven."

4. Accepting God's call and joining Him on His mission. Vs. 8

Then I heard the voice of the Lord, saying, "Whom shall I send, and who will go for us?" Then I said, "Here am I, send me!"

The Blueprint for hearing God today:

- Look up-- see God clearly.
- Look in--Let His Spirit convict and cleanse.
- Look back -- to Christ's sacrifice on the cross and receive his Grace and transformation.
- Listen-- with your ears and heart.
- Respond-- Volunteer to be sent.

Discussion Questions – Isaiah 6:1-8

Encountering God (vv. 1-4)

1. What details stand out to you in Isaiah's vision of the Lord? Why do you think those details matter?
2. How does Isaiah describe God's holiness? What emotions does this scene stir in you?
3. Why do you think the seraphim continually declare, "Holy, holy, holy"?
4. What does the shaking temple and filling smoke suggest about God's presence?

Responding to God's Holiness (v. 5)

5. Isaiah becomes deeply aware of his own sin. Why does encountering God often lead to self-awareness?
6. What does Isaiah mean by being a "man of unclean lips"? How might that apply today?
7. How do people today tend to respond to conviction—avoidance, denial, humility, repentance?

Experiencing Grace (vv. 6-7)

8. Why is it significant that God initiates Isaiah's cleansing?
9. What does the burning coal symbolize about forgiveness and purification?
10. How does this passage balance God's holiness with His mercy?

Accepting God's Call (v. 8)

11. Why does God ask, "Whom shall I send?" instead of directly commanding Isaiah?
12. What stands out about Isaiah's response, "Here am I. Send me!"?
13. How does forgiveness prepare Isaiah for mission?

14. When have you experienced a deeper awareness of God's holiness?
15. What might be holding you back from responding fully to God's call?
16. Where might God be asking you to say, "Here am I—send me" in your life right now?
