Acts 2 ESV 2When the day of Pentecost arrived, they	
were all together in one place. ² And suddenly there came from heaven a sound like a mighty rushing wind, and it filled the entire house	
where they were sitting. ³ And divided tongues as of fire appeared to them and rested on each	
one of them. ⁴ And they were all filled with the Holy Spirit and began to speak in other tongues as the Spirit gave them utterance.	
Without the Passover Lamb (Jesus), we don't	
have Pentecost.	
Wind and fire are symbols of God's presence.	
Now there were dwelling in Jerusalem Jews, devout men from every nation under	
neaven. ⁶ And at this sound the multitude came together, and they were bewildered,	
pecause each one was hearing them speak In his own language. ⁷ And they were amazed	
and astonished, saying, "Are not all these who are speaking Galileans? ⁸ And how is it	
that we hear, each of us in his own native	
anguage? ⁹ Parthians and Medes and Elamites and residents of Mesopotamia, Judea and	
Cappadocia, Pontus and Asia, ¹⁰ Phrygia and Pamphylia, Egypt and the parts of Libya	
belonging to Cyrene, and visitors from Rome, both Jews and proselytes, Cretans and	
Arabianswe hear them telling in our own tongues the mighty works of God." ¹² And all	
were amazed and perplexed, saying to one another, "What does this mean?" ¹³ But others	
mocking said, "They are filled with new wine."	
Jesus' promise fulfilled. (Acts 1:8)	

Hebut Peter, standing with the eleven, lifted up his voice and addressed them: "Men of Judea and all who dwell in Jerusalem, let this be known to you, and give ear to my words. 15 For these people are not drunk as you suppose, since it is only the third hour of the day. 16 But this is what was uttered through the prophet Joel:	notes
that I will pour out my Spirit on all flesh, and your sons and your daughters hsall prophesy, and your young men shall see visions, and your old men shall dream dreams; ¹⁸ even on my male servants and female servants in those days I will pour out my Spirit, and they shall prophesy. ¹⁹ And I will show wonders in the heavens above and signs on the earth below, blood, and fire, and vapor of smoke; ²⁰ the sun shall be turned to darkness and the moon to blood, before the day of the Lord comes, the great and magnificent day. ²¹ And it shall come to pass that <u>everyone</u> who calls upon the name of the Lord shall be saved.	
Last days: Prophecy, Visions, Dreams, and Signs	
The same and the same and the same and the rest of the heart, and said to Peter and the rest of the apostles, "Brethren, what shall we do?" Breter said to them "Repent, and each of you be baptized in the name of Jesus Christ for the forgiveness of your sins; and you will receive the gift of the Holy Spirit. For the promise is for you and your children and for all who are far off, as mana as the Lord our God will call to Himself." And with many other words he solemnly testified and kept on exhorting them, saying, "Be saved from this perverse generation!" The saved them, those who had received his word were baptized; and that day there were added about three thousand souls.

- 4. v. 37 " Now when they heard this, they were pierced to the heart, and said to Peter and the rest of the apostles, "Brethren, what shall we do?" What is Peter's application on the day of Pentecost? Why were the people cut to the heart by Peter's message?
