PREVIOUSLY...


You Are Mine! (Exodus 19:1-8)

- The Mountain (19:1-2), the Mediator (19:3), and the Message (19:4-6)
 - "You are Mine... for I have redeemed you."
 - The foundational language of the Mosaic Covenant is <u>love</u>, not <u>law!</u> The Law was never intended to be a way <u>to</u> life, but a way <u>of</u> life for those who have already been redeemed.
 - Set apart,... but not in <u>isolation</u>, but as an <u>illustration</u> of living for the <u>glory</u> of <u>God</u> and extending an <u>invitation</u> to the same end.

He Is Not Safe! (Exodus 19:9-25)

- Approaching the Unapproachable: On His Terms. EXODUS 19:9-25
 - Exodus 19 begins with God's <u>heart for</u> His people, but it continues with God's <u>holiness</u> <u>before</u> His people. The first speaks of God's <u>immanence</u> He is <u>near</u> us.
 The second speaks of His <u>transcendence</u> He is far <u>above</u> us.
 - There is no approaching Yahweh without consecration (v. 10-11a), without invitation (v. 11b, 13b), without limitation (v. 12-13a), and without trepidation (v. 16).
