Flu/COVID/Common Cold Update We are entering flu season. If you did not receive flu vaccine in September, get it in October. On September 12 updated COVID boosters became available that more closely target the circulating variants. You may receive COVID booster & flu vaccine on the same visit. CDC recommends having the updated COVID booster this fall.

Symptoms: fever (not everyone w/ flu will have fever), cough, sore throat, runny or stuffy nose, muscle or body aches, headaches, and fatigue (tiredness). Some people may have vomiting and diarrhea, though this is more common in children than adults. Prevention:

-Avoid close contact with people who are sick.

-If you are sick, limit contact with others as much as possible to keep from infecting them. (Do not attend church service if you are sick, but you may watch it on-line.)

-Cover coughs and sneezes-cover with tissue and discard in trash after you use it.

-Wash hands often with soap and water for at least 20 seconds. You may use an alcohol-based hand cleanser if soap and water is not available. -Avoid touching eyes, nose, & mouth. -Clean and disinfect surfaces and objects that may be contaminated with viruses that cause these illnesses.

-CDC recommends that people stay home for at least 24 hours after fever is gone for flu and quarantine at home for 5 days if you test positive for COVID19.

Health Education - October is Breast Cancer Awareness Month Breast cancer is the second most common cancer in women after skin cancer. Risk Factors:

-Older age -Being overweight -Smoking -Drinking alcohol

-Dense breast tissue

-Personal history of breast cancer or benign breast disease

-Family history in mother, sister, or daughter

-Reproductive history resulting in greater exposure to estrogen.

-Taking hormone therapy for symptoms of menopause

-Radiation therapy to the breast or chest

--Not getting enough exercise Prevention:

-Breast self-exam -Healthy diet -Stop smoking -Increase exercise

If you aren't familiar with OCC It is an annual worldwide mission sponsored by Samaritan's Purse. It started in war-torn Bosnia in 1993 by giving the Bosnian children shoeboxes full of fun items to help them cope with the tragic events. Since then, over 200 million needy children in over 170 countries have received a shoebox. In addition to the shoebox, they receive the Good News of Jesus Christ through the Greatest Journey, a Gospel presentation in their own language. Participating in OCC is a way we can spread the Gospel to all nations in the pursuit of making disciples. (Matt.28:19) HOW COOL IS THAT?

Here is how it works at KUMC:

3 OPTIONS to PARTICIPATE (Choose 1)

- 1. Pack Your Own Box: Pick up an empty OCC shoebox from church – the box will contain a list of handy information about items that can and can't be packed. Pick an age group and gender and buy gifts and essentials to fill the box, then turn in box by Nov 12. (Feel free to team up with others to split costs)
- 2. Help Fill Congregation Boxes: The congregation will be collecting items for the 10-14 yr old age group. We hope to fill 48 boxes (24 girls/24 boys). **Sign up** to buy specific item(s) via the OCC board in the narthex, then place them in the OCC donation box in narthex by October 29.
