Flu/COVID/Common Cold Update
Ref: Centers for Disease Control & Prevention
(CDC) We are entering flu season.
CDC reports that September & October are the best times to receive flu vaccine. CDC recommends that everyone 6 months and older receive the flu vaccine before the end of October. The best way to prevent flu and its potentially serious complications is by getting yearly flu vaccine. It has been shown in several studies to reduce the severity of illness in people who get vaccinated but still get sick.

Difference between Flu, COVID19, & Common Cold. They are contagious respiratory illnesses, but they are caused by different viruses. Since

symptoms are similar, diagnostic testing can help determine which illness you have.

Symptoms: Fever (not everyone with flu will have fever), cough, sore throat, runny or stuffy nose, muscle or body aches, headaches, & fatigue (tiredness). Some people may have vomiting and diarrhea though this is more common in children than adults. **Prevention**: Avoid close contact with people who are sick.

•If you are sick, limit contact with others as much as possible to keep from infecting them (Do Not attend church service if you are sick, but you may watch it on-line).

•Cover coughs & sneezes, cover with tissue & discard in trash after use it •Wash hands often with soap and water for at least 20 seconds. You may use an alcohol–based hand cleanser if soap and water is not available.

•Avoid touching eyes, nose, & mouth.
•Clean and disinfect surfaces and objects that may be contaminated with viruses that cause these illnesses.
CDC recommends that people stay home for at least 24 hours after fever is gone for flu and quarantine at home for 5 days if you test positive for COVID19.

Health Education: Back to School Tips to help your children prepare for school:

- •Begin the conversation early.
- •Provide consistency and stability when and where you can.
- •Encourage them to focus on what they can control.
- •Help them protect their body.
- Keep their schedule manageable.
- •Look for signs of stress and anxiety.
- •Connect with professional help, if needed.

Redefining the Old for something New

About 18 months ago, the Educate & Equip work area requested that the church explore the possibility of bringing on staff a person to fill the role of Coordinator of Intergenerational Ministries; that project was approved. So in January of 2023, KUMC extended an offer to Mr. J.J. Gibbs to fill that position. What an exceptional addition he has been to the staff here at KUMC.

But as with any job, there comes time to evaluate and tweak. As we began the evaluation in the spring, it was determined by the SPPRC, the Senior Pastor, and J.J. that maybe we needed to redefine the scope and responsibilities of the position.

In April, a special sub-committee of the SPPRC was commissioned to look at all aspects of the position mentioned above and the overall utilization of J.J.'s time and talent. In keeping with the vision of members of KUMC to expand its ministry to reach people of all ages, we have approved and renamed a Director of Program Ministry position. This person in this position, currently J.J., will work to bring people from diverse backgrounds together, encouraging faith formation and spiritual growth in an intergenerational community.

He will continue to report directly to the Senior Pastor and increase his weekly time to meet his new objectives, all within the current budget. He will also chair a new Council on Ministry, to include the chairs from our everyday work areas. This will help to develop clear, measurable, and challenging goals and deliverables and ensure the completion of these within established timeframes.

Should any members of KUMC have any questions about any aspect of this, please reach out to Steve Spurr or any member of the SPPRC committee, or the Pastor. The change of title and responsibility will be effective 1 September 2023.
