have any questions. Update on FLU /COVID/Respiratory Syncytial Virus (RSV) - The Communicable Disease Center (CDC) is monitoring the spread of these respiratory viruses weekly as it did last year. Per November 11, 2023, Respiratory Activity is low overall in Virginia, but increasing. COVID-19, RSV, and flu are increasing in most of the country. However, Winchester and Frederick County are LOW in transmission. Each household can receive 4 COVID-19 test kits free at COVID Tests.gov. There are vaccines for Flu, RSV, and COVID-19. It is not too late to receive the flu vaccine. The COVID-19 has been formulated for Omnicron varieties, so CDC is recommending that we receive the new updated COVID-19 vaccine. There is also a vaccine for RSV and CDC is recommending that the young and persons over 60 receive the RSV vaccine. Ask your physician if these vaccines are recommended for you. These vaccines may be obtained at the pharmacies. There is treatment for COVID-19 but you need to receive the treatment as soon as symptoms occur. If you have symptoms fever, cough, sore throat, runny or stuffy nose, muscle or body aches, headaches, fatigue (tiredness), loss of taste or smell. Stay Home, get tested, and seek treatment - contact your physician for recommendations for you. Prevention tools: vaccines, handwashing, cleaning, air ventilation by opening windows, masks.

Staffing Update

It is with mixed feelings that we must announce that JJ Gibbs will be leaving our staff in January as his wife, Christina, will be taking a new Camp Director position in North Carolina. We wish them well in their new ministry opportunity and pray God's blessing on them and their family. Christina Gibbs will be leading the worship service on Sunday, Dec. 31st, and we will celebrater their ministry with us on the Shenandoah River District.

Trustee Committee Update

The new roof on the Education Building is complete. This type of roof is called an EPDM ballasted roof. EPDM (ethylene propylene diene terpolymer) is a synthetic rubber membrane that covers the roof and then ballast (large rock about 1-to-1.5-inch diameter) is spread over the top to hold it in place. For our job, they removed the ballast and the existing 0.040-inch-thick membrane, replaced it with a 0.060-inchthick membrane and then reinstalled the same ballast. They must seal the membrane at all the edges, pass throughs and joints. The roof has a low slope to prevent water from pooling, though it looks flat in the photos.

In addition, the exterior painting and wood repair is complete as well as new electrical outlets installed outside the sanctuary and in the fellowship hall for the coffee bar. The semi-annual HVAC maintenance was also completed.


