Scripture: *Matthew 6:34.* Do not worry about tomorrow, for tomorrow will bring worries of its own. Today's trouble is enough for today.

Cancer Awareness Month – promotes education, early detection, fundraising for research, and support for those affected by the disease. 1 in 8 women in the US will develop breast cancer in her lifetime. There are over 4 million breast cancer survivors in the US. Early Detection – Breast Self-Exam - all women can perform this to themselves each month to check for changes in their breasts. Have annual mammograms. Although rare, men can get breast cancer, too. Lifetime risk for US man to develop breast cancer is 1 in 726.

Respiratory Virus Season is here – Protect yourself and get this season's flu & COVID 19 vaccines. Also receive the Respiratory Syncytial Virus (RSV) vaccine if you have not received it. Prevention:

- Cover your mouth and nose with a tissue when you cough and sneeze. Throw used tissues in the trash. If you don't have a tissue, cough or sneeze into your elbow, not your hands.
- Wash your hands or use hand sanitizer frequently
- Teach children the correct way to wash their hands
- Clean frequently touched surfaces, such as countertops, handrails, and doorknobs regularly
- Have clean air by bringing in fresh air.
 You will notice that the windows in the sanctuary are opened at the top to bring in fresh air.
- Wearing a mask is an additional prevention strategy that you can choose to further protect yourself and others, if you desire
- If you have symptoms, get a COVID test.
 Stay home and away from others until your symptoms get better and you are fever free for 24 hours. Then take added precautions for the next 5 days if mild symptoms or 10 days if moderate symptoms. CDC.gov
