Years of Worshiping Together This Kernstown Community Thanksgiving service, tonight 129 consecutive years strong, reflects a wonderful story. The Opeguon Church building was destroyed twice during the 1800's, first when it was occupied and desecrated internally during the Civil War and again when a fire destroyed the sanctuary in 1873. During both of those periods, the Opequon Church continued to gather for worship, welcomed by the Methodists of Kernstown. In 1897, after 24 years of meeting together at Kernstown, the current Memorial Sanctuary at Opequon was constructed, completed in October of that year. As an expression of gratitude for its hospitality, the Opequon congregation invited the Kernstown congregation to share in worship in the newly completed sanctuary on the evening before Thanksgiving. That tradition has continued and expanded over the years, with the choirs combining for special music, communion being served, and the guest pastor preaching while the host pastor plans the service. Join us for a time of fellowship following the service in our fellowship hall. Our meeting tonight for the 127th time is a visible expression of our unity as Christians and of our shared commitment to mission in our community and beyond. We are grateful for one another, the ties that bind us, and pledge to work together in demonstrating discipleship through love for God and neighbor.
