# BEGINNING OF ALL THINGS

**CENTRAL TRUTH** | God is the Creator and Ruler of all things.

#### **AS YOU GO**

These are simple questions to ask your student as you go home from church or go about your weekly activities.

- I Who is someone you find very creative?
- I What makes him or her so creative?

#### **FAMILY DEVOTION**

Follow up with your student later in the week and go through the following summary and discussion questions together.

### **SUMMARY** | Genesis 1:1-5,26-2:3

In Genesis 1, we learn that the Lord is the self-existent, eternal God who created the heavens and the earth out of nothing. As the Creator and Ruler of all things, God calls His creation "good." We also learn about the crowning achievement of creation: human beings! God made both male and female in His image and likeness. And as His image bearers, humans are to reflect God's character, rule, and goodness into the world. This creation was followed with God's rest. However, God didn't rest because He was tired; He simply ceased from His creative work. Creation was complete.
