AS YOU GO

These are simple questions to ask your student as you go home from church or go about your weekly activities.

- I Who is the most humble person you know? What makes this person humble?
- Who is a famous person you follow on social media? What makes this person interesting to follow?

FAMILY DEVOTION

Follow up with your student later in the week and go through the following summary and discussion questions together.

SUMMARY John 1:35-51

While he was standing with his students, John the Baptist saw Jesus and proclaimed, "Look the Lamb of God!" Hearing his statement about Jesus, John's two disciples began following the Lord. One of the disciples, Andrew, told his brother, Simon, that they had found the long-awaited Messiah. When Simon was brought to Jesus, he was given a new name—Cephas, meaning "rock." After leaving for Galilee, Jesus found Philip, and Philip found Nathanael, who was doubtful and skeptical about Jesus. Jesus revealed His supernatural knowledge and also taught them that He is the pinnacle of God's self-revelation, as well as the only way into God's presence.

- **O2.** What can we learn about responding to people who doubt Jesus from this week's passage?
