CENTRAL TRUTH | Jesus, the greater Moses, is the Bread of Life.

AS YOU GO

These are simple questions to ask your student as you go home from church or go about your weekly activities.

- What do you think would be the most difficult food for you to give up if you needed to?
- What is a food you didn't like before but now enjoy?

FAMILY DEVOTION

Follow up with your student later in the week and go through the following summary and discussion questions together.

SUMMARY | Genesis 1:1; Exodus 1:1

In this week's passage, Jesus takes a boy's modest meal and feeds a crowd of hungry people. God's provision was so great that there was more food at the end of the meal than what they started with! As with His conversation with the Samaritan woman, Jesus uses an object of physical need to show how He meets a greater need. Jesus is the better Moses who rescues those who believe in Him. He is the better Bread sent from heaven to meet humanity's greatest need, and He is the Great "I AM"—God in the flesh!

DISCUSSION QUESTIONS

Follow up with your student later in the week and go through the following summary and discussion questions together.

- ← How does John show us that Jesus is the greater Moses? Why does John do this?
- ↑ What does Jesus's "I AM" statement mean?

PRAY: Lord Jesus, You are the Bread of Life who satisfies our spiritual hunger. Teach us to humbly submit to Your lordship and rule. .
