

THE TOMB IS EMPTY!

CENTRAL TRUTH | Jesus reigns victorious as the risen King.

AS YOU GO

These are simple questions to ask your student as you go home from church or go about your weekly activities.

- I When have you been so excited about news you were told that you struggled to contain your excitement?
- I When you shared this news with someone, how that person respond to your excitement?

FAMILY DEVOTION

Follow up with your student later in the week and go through the following summary and discussion questions together.

SUMMARY | John 20:1-18

Upon arriving at the tomb, Mary Magdalene (and several other women; see Mark 16:2) noticed that the stone in front of Jesus's tomb had been rolled away. Mary ran to share this observation with Peter and another disciple, who was most likely the apostle John. The two disciples found Mary's discovery, and John believed. After the disciples returned to where they were staying, Mary was confronted by two angels and then the resurrected Jesus Himself. Naturally, Mary was thrilled, but Jesus told her not to cling to Him—He had work for her to do. She must share the news of His resurrection with the disciples.

DISCUSSION QUESTIONS

Follow up with your student later in the week and go through the following summary and discussion questions together.

01.  Why is Jesus's resurrection good news for us?
02.  Mary was called to share the good news with others. What would it look like for us to do the same this week?

PRAY: Heavenly Father, thank You for Jesus, who reigns victorious as the risen King. By the Spirit's power, help us to share the good news of Jesus with others.
