A MESSAGE FROM THE ELDERS:

Bob lived on a farm with his family. With his income he made a good living and the family enjoyed raising their own vegetables, milk and eggs. But, when his children were young, disease took Bob's eyesight, which cost him his job and his income. Adjustments were made and his wife Helen became a nurse to provide a living wage. Bob took care of the children and chores at home, making improvements to the farm so that he could run it – even without eyesight. He cleverly constructed a series of pathways with overhead guidewires leading to different areas of the farm – the garden, the chicken coop, the cow-pen... Stepping out of his back door, he would hook his cane to a guidewire and walk to any area of the farm he chose. When a barn was needed, he built it himself. After raising their three children, Bob became an elder in their church. Living just outside of a college town, Bob & Helen's church had many students, whom they often invited to the farm to spend an afternoon. Bob's ingenuity eventually captured the attention of the local news channel who ran a feature story on the blind man who built a farm and ran it himself. Bob and Helen passed on a few years ago, but the legacy they left was one of seeing their projects through to completion – whether running a farm, raising a family, or shepherding the church. And in this way, they modeled what God is like.

You and I are works-in-progress. God is working in us through his Spirit to transform us into something wonderful – the image of his son. Trouble will not deter him. Jesus died for our sins. Transformation is his goal, and he will see it through.

I thank my God every time I remember you. In all my prayers for all of you, I always pray with joy because of your partnership in the gospel from the first day until now, being confident of this, that he who began a good work in you will carry it on to completion until the day. Philippians 1:3-3

MISSION CORNER:



This week we have the opportunity to hear from one of our own! As many of you know, Liam Bristow-Hannah has recently taken a trip to Honduras. He traveled there from May 5-14th helping a lot of people with projects and sharing the light of God's love. Working with a group called Breaking Chains, they built 4 houses to shelter them from the wind and rain and give them a place for their families to grow. They also conducted a VBS for the local children and attended their church on Sunday. In addition, they helped teach the children English at a bilingual school and painted and organized the Breaking Chains facilities.

It is very important for a missionary to experience the culture around them when they go for a trip to another country. Liam reports visiting Rotan where he, "Enjoyed the beautiful views and amazing scenery of the Honduran landscape and soaked in some sun". In his report he expresses thankfulness for the "awesome opportunity" to acknowledging that it couldn't have happened without help from those who supported him financially (many of which are members of the Central Kitsap Church of Christ).
