A MESSAGE FROM THE ELDERS:

"Betsie, there's no way even God can make me grateful for a flea", said Corrie. At Betsie's insistence, the two sisters, in obedience to God's command to "give thanks in all circumstances" (1Th 5:18), had already thanked God: for the Bible they had managed to sneak into the notorious Ravensbruck concentration camp; for having been assigned to the same stinking, lice-infested, overcrowded "Barracks 28" together; and for the hundreds of women who would have the opportunity to meet Jesus in that place as a result of having a single Bible. Or as Corrie put it, "Oh, all right. Thank you for the jammed, crammed, stuffed, packed, suffocating crowds". But she drew the line at being thankful for the fleas that infested the straw-covered rancid bedding.

As time went by the women of the barracks began to gather each night around that Bible for services that Corrie referred to as "little previews of heaven". And while the prison guards treated the women with great cruelty each day, they never molested them at night while in the barracks. One day, Betsie discovered the reason why. Because the barracks was crawling with fleas, no guard would enter it.

This story is told by holocaust survivor Corrie Ten Boom. You can read more about it in her book "The Hiding Place". Rejoicing and giving thanks in all circumstances is a powerful way to cope with trouble when it comes. And as Corrie found out, "There is no pit so deep that God's love is not deeper still".

Our culture has become angry and constantly pressures us to join with them in being angry about this or that. That is one way that worldly people gain allies – by trying to get you to be angry about the things they are angry about. But anger tends to lead us away from the life God wants us to live. And, while there are many injustices in the world, the express command of God is that we, his people, rejoice.

- · In the concentration camp, Corrie rejoiced
- · In prison, Paul rejoiced. (Acts 16:25)
- \cdot After being beaten, the apostles rejoiced. (Acts 5:41)
- \cdot And on the cross, Jesus rejoiced. (Heb 12:2)

"Finally, my brothers, rejoice in the Lord! It is no trouble for me to write the same things to you again, and it is a safeguard for you." (Php 3:1)
