A MESSAGE FROM THE ELDERS:

Each year, as the Christmas season approached, my children would ask "What do you want for Christmas"? "Peace on Earth" was my consistent reply. It was an honest request. Though it was beyond my children's ability to give, it is what I desired most for them, for our family, for our community, and for our world.

As the season of giving approaches, families endeavor to find, acquire, and provide gifts for one another. Many seek that perfect gift that will adequately convey the feeling and appreciation one has for another. Often one seeks out a gift that glimmers or shines, is sometimes rare, or comforting, or maybe it's seasonally popular. Some give gifts that are practical and useful. Some offer gifts that are expensive or difficult to acquire so as to demonstrate sacrificial love and admiration. In every case, gifts given are an attempt by one to please another. The challenge then becomes knowing what will please the other, and is it within one's ability to give?

Year after year, I would respond to my children with the same answer. Give me "Peace on Earth". And every year, I would receive new socks, or cologne, or some other useful trinket. That is until one year, when late one evening, driving to or from somewhere, my daughter requested I make a turn, then look to my right. I obliged her request, and to my surprise, I was rewarded with a most excellent gift. There, across a field made white with new snow, was written in 6-foot-high letters fashioned out of twinkle lights and shining in the night air was the phrase

"Peace on Earth." The beaming smile on her face said it all. Though she had not made the display herself, she was responsible for making sure I saw it that night, and every other time we drove past the display while it remained. It was a most thoughtful gift that I still remember with great fondness to this day.

There are many unsettling events in the world today, and it is easy to get caught up in the turmoil. But as we saw this past week by the peace accord that took place between world leaders regarding Gaza, when individuals determine to move toward peace, it can occur. If one has their mind set on finding peace, we will see it, can celebrate it, and can encourage others to enjoy it while it lasts. With that in mind, please pray for peace. Peace within one's family. Peace at work. Peace in our community. Peace within our nation. Peace between nations, and continued peace on the world's stage. Peace in our lifetime is possible. Celebrate the moments when peace appears. It may seem beyond one's ability to obtain, but in spite of all that the enemy would send to distract us, the Peace of God remains. We need only open our eyes to appreciate it with great fondness. Philippians 4:6-8
